Members to External Organizations

SUMMARY

This is the second informational follow-up report per the request of the Finance and Management Committee regarding the utilization of Funds donated by Council Members to external organizations. The first report summarized the responses received from external organizations regarding the use of donated Funds, and was submitted to the Finance and Management Committee on October 24, 2006. Due to the number of external organizations that did not provide a response, direction was given by the Finance and Management Committee to resend the request letter to those non-responsive external organizations and include: "Failure to respond may jeopardize future donations"

FISCAL IMPACT

This is an informational report only; there are no fiscal impacts.

BACKGROUND

The Oakland City Council contributes Funds every year to support projects and services that will benefit the Oakland Community. To ensure accountability for all contributions, the Finance and Management Committee directed the Controller to identify, research, inquire, and document activities that were supported by donated Funds to external organizations.

DISCUSSION

Determination of Funds Donated to External Organizations:

Detailed reports from July 01, 2004 through June 15, 2006 for all Council Member expenditures were analyzed.

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Expenditures were classified as a donation when an external organization received Funds, and the request for payment was not the result of a contract, purchase order, or invoice issued by or to the City of Oakland.

Letters and Forms Sent to External Organizations That Received Donated Funds:

On August 28, 2006, twenty-two (22) external organizations were sent a letter with the "City of Oakland Contribution" form (See Attachment C), requesting information by September 26, 2006 regarding their utilization of donated Funds.

• Six (6) of the twenty-two (22) external organizations provided a response.

On October 24, 2006 direction was given by the Finance and Management Committee to resend the request letter to the seventeen (17) non-responsive external organizations and include: "Failure to respond may jeopardize future donations" (See Attachment B)

Recap of Responses Received From External Organizations:

In total twenty- two (22) external organizations were sent a letter and form requesting information regarding their utilization of donated Funds.

- Fourteen (14) external organizations have now responded
- Eight (8) external organizations have not provided a response
