Increase The Contract Amount For The Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (Formerly Known As Greenman Field) Renovation And Community Park Project With Star Construction, Inc., In The Amount of \$362,000.00, Bringing The Total Contract Amount To \$1,562,000.00, For The Construction Of A New Landscaped Soundwall; And 2) Allocate \$362,000.00 Of Redevelopment Agency Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area Funds To The Project; And 3) To Authorize Staff To Identify Additional Funding For The Ballfield Irrigation and

Drainage Improvements For The Project

#### **SUMMARY**

Resolutions have been prepared authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee, to increase the construction contract with Star Construction, Inc., by an amount of \$362,000.00, bringing the total contract amount to \$1,562,000.00 for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project, to allocate \$362,000.00 from the Redevelopment Agency Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area Fund for the construction of a new landscaped soundwall, and to authorize staff to identify additional funding for the ballfield irrigation and drainage improvements at the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex.

The landscaped sound wall construction was an additive alternate to the original Carter Gilmore Sports Complex Renovation and Community Park design. However, sufficient funding was not initially available to include these items of work in the construction contract with Star Construction, Inc. Now with the identification of an additional funding source, staff requests to add the landscaped soundwall element back into the project. However, ballfield irrigation and drainage improvements for the project are not funded at this time, and staff will continue to seek and identify additional funding sources.

This project fulfills the Mayoral and City Council's goal of "providing for clean, well maintained and accessible streets, sidewalks, facilities, amenities, parks, recreational facilities, and trees." The project is located in Council District 6.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The Carter Gilmore Sports Complex Renovation and Community Park project construction budget was originally funded with \$500,000.00 from the Proposition 40 Roberti-Z'berg-Harris Block Grant Program Funds from the California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks and Coastal Protection Act of 2002 Program (Fund 2134), Capital Project Management Organization (92270), Greenman Field Renovation Project (C197010); \$600,000.00 from Measure K, Series 2000D Fund (5014), Capital Project Management Organization (92270), Greenman Field Renovation Project (C197020); and \$500,000.00 from Proposition 40 Per Capita Grant Program (Fund 2134), Capital Project Management Organization (92270), Greenman Field Renovation Project (C197030). Contract Compliance fees will be allocated under Project C197010. The Public Art assessment of 1.5% is included in the Greenman Field Renovation project budget by integrating the art component directly into the project design.

Approval of the proposed resolutions will authorize the City to accept and appropriate \$362,000.00 from the Redevelopment Agency Coliseum Operations Fund (9450) Coliseum Project (S82600) to the City's Oakland Redevelopment Agency Fund (7780), Greenman Field Renovation Project (project number to be established).

The newly renovated fields may increase patron usage and raise expectations for maintenance beyond the currently budgeted levels in order to preserve the new conditions. The new landscaped soundwall could require regular graffiti removal. Once a month graffiti removal could cost up to \$2,400.00 annually depending on the extent of graffiti and amount of labor required. The new children's tot-lot amenities expanded landscaping and lighting that will require additional maintenance. For example, the tot lot will require safety inspections and repairs to maintain a safe play environment. The additional landscaping will require weeding, trimming, irrigation repairs and litter abatement on a regular basis. Pedestrian lights will require electricity and regular maintenance. The additional maintenance costs are estimated at \$16,000.00 per year and are not yet budgeted. The Public Works Agency will include the additional costs in the 2007-2009 Budget request.

#### BACKGROUND

Resolution No. 80037 C.M.S., was approved by the City Council on July 18, 2006, authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee, to informally re-bid, negotiate if necessary, and to award a construction contract within budget for an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000.00, without return to Council for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project.

On August 10, 2006, the PWA, Contract Administration received two bids for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project base bid and four additive alternates. Star Construction, Inc. (San Mateo) submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid of \$1,294,600.00 for the base bid and \$912,000.00 for the four additive alternates. The engineer's estimate for the base bid is \$1,200,000.00 and for the

four additive alternates is \$873,000.00. Staff negotiated with Star Construction, Inc., to reduce their base bid amount from \$1,294,600.00 to \$1,200,000.00.

There were no funds available for the project's four additive alternates. The four additive alternates are: 1) Soundwall; 2) Greenery for Soundwall; 3) Ballfield irrigation; and 4) Ballfield drainage improvements. Staff worked with the Redevelopment Agency and Parks and Recreation to identify funding for the landscaped sound wall two additive alternates. The additional funding identified does not provide for the other two additive alternates, the ballfield irrigation and drainage improvements, however, staff is working to identify the funding required to complete the ballfield improvements.

The Redevelopment Agency requests authorization to allocate \$362,000.00 from Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area funds to cover the landscaped soundwall. The community requested a soundwall because the baseball fields and new community park are located directly behind several residential homes. The sound wall will provide a permanent decorative structure that will benefit the community by decreasing the noise from the baseball games and the new community park.

The City and the Redevelopment Agency Cooperative Agreement entered into on July 1, 2004, generally governs the provision of assistance and the payment of funds between the two agencies, including Redevelopment Agency financial contributions and other assistance to support City public improvements.

Now that funding for the landscaped sound wall construction has been identified, staff requests approval to implement this important project element through the contract with Star Construction, Inc.

The City's L/SLBE and local trucking programs have been met by Star Construction, Inc. There will be L/SLBE participation of \$749,850.00 (48%), which exceeds the 20% L/SLBE requirements, and the local trucking participation will be \$15,000.00 (100%).

The contractor is required to have 50% of the work hours performed by Oakland residents and 50% of all new hires are to be Oakland residents. The L/SLBE information has been verified by the Contract Compliance & Employment Services Division of the City Administrator's Office and is included as Attachment A.

The Notice to Proceed for the base bid was issued on November 10, 2006. The project duration is 120 working days from the date of the Notice to Proceed and completion is anticipated by Spring 2007.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The scope of work for the entire project consists of site improvements to three baseball fields, ADA improvements, the construction of a new batting cage and new restroom facility. In addition, a new community park will be constructed and consist of an eight foot tall landscaped

soundwall, new concrete pathways, new entry fencing on 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue, a small children's play area including swings, play apparatus, and rubberized play surface, and a new irrigated lawn area with plantings.

The Carter Gilmore Sports Complex was recently renamed from the Greenman Field Park by the Oakland Unified School District. The Carter Gilmore Sports Complex is located on 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue adjacent to Havenscourt Middle School (1390 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue) and Lockwood Elementary School (6701 International Blvd.). The 6.8-acre site consists of 4 baseball fields that are the home fields for the Oakland Babe Ruth League, which is the primary user of the fields. There are approximately 960 youth participating in the league who range in age from 5 to 15 years old.

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The new landscaped soundwall will provide a permanent decorative structure that will decrease the noise from the baseball games and the new community park. Staff is requesting authorization to increase the construction contract with Star Construction, Inc., to add the construction of a new landscaped soundwall, and to increase the contract by an amount of \$362,000.00, to cover this additional work, for a total contract amount of \$1,562,000.00. Staff is also requesting authorization to allocate \$362,000.00 in Redevelopment funds. Upon, approval of these resolutions, funding from the Redevelopment Agency Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area will be available to pay for this added improvement.

The ballfield irrigation and drainage improvements are necessary to increase the usage of the ballfields and meet the basic standards for the Babe Ruth League. Presently the fields do not drain properly and hold water after any rain storm, rendering them unplayable for several days. Staff will work to identify the additional funding to add the ballfield irrigation and drainage improvements at the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex project.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic:</u> Work on the project will generate business tax, sales tax, and other revenues for the City.

<u>Environmental</u>: The project will take into consideration green building technologies, and to the extent feasible, will recycle materials and debris. The new rubber play surface is made from recycled tires.

<u>Social Equity:</u> The project will provide upgraded recreational facilities for neighborhood children and their families.

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

All new physical improvements will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The project will improve accessibility to persons with disabilities with ADA compliant play surfaces and equipment.

#### RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

It is recommended that the resolutions be approved for the following:

- 1. To increase the construction contract in an amount of \$362,000.00, for a total contract amount of \$1,562,000.00, for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project.
- 2. To allocate and accept the contribution of \$362,000.00 from the Redevelopment Agency Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area Fund for the construction of a new landscaped soundwall.
- 3. To authorize staff to identify additional funding for the ballfield irrigation and drainage improvements at the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex.

Adding the work to this contract will be cost efficient and the most effective and coordinated way to complete the construction of a new landscaped soundwall.

#### ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

City Council is requested to approve these resolutions.

On August 18, 2006, Contract Compliance & Employment Services reviewed two (2) bids received in response to the above referenced project. The initial analysis was based on a base bid amount of \$1,294,600. The Project Manager requested that CC&ES perform a second analysis which would include the base bid plus alternates one through four (1-4). On November 27, 2006, Project Delivery requested that CC&ES perform a third analysis which would include the base bid plus alternates one and two (1 & 2).

Below is the outcome of our compliance evaluation for the twenty percent (20%) minimum participation requirement and a preliminary review for compliance with the Equal Benefits Ordinance.

WHEREAS, the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project will provide upgraded recreational facilities for neighborhood children and their families; and

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2006, the City Council approved Resolution No. 80037 C.M.S., authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee to informally re-bid, negotiate if necessary, and to award a construction contract within budget for an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000.00, without return to Council for the Greenman Field Renovation and Community Park project; and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2006, the Public Works Agency, Contract Administration Division received two bids for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex Renovation and Community Park project for the base bid and four additive alternates; and

WHEREAS, Star Construction, Inc. (San Mateo), submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid of \$1,294,600 for the base bid and \$912,000.00 for the four additive alternates; and

**WHEREAS**; staff negotiated with Star Construction, Inc., to reduce their base bid amount from \$1,294,600 to \$1,200,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the landscaped sound wall construction and the ball field irrigation and drainage improvements were additive alternates to the original Carter Gilmore Field Renovation and Community Park design; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funding was not initially available to include these items of work in the construction contract with Star Construction, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, now with the identification of an additional funding source, staff requests to add these important project elements back for implementation; and

WHEREAS, staff is requesting authorization to increase the construction contract with Star Construction, Inc., to add the construction of a new landscaped soundwall, and to increase the contract in the amount of three hundred sixty two thousand dollars (\$362,000.00), for a total contract amount of one million five hundred sixty two thousand dollars (\$1,562,000.00) to cover the additional improvements; and

WHEREAS, funds are available to cover the additional scope of work in the amount of \$362,000 from the Redevelopment Agency Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area Fund (Fund 9450, Project No. S82600); and

WHEREAS, funds are not currently available to cover other additional work including the ballfield irrigation an drainage improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City lacks the equipment and qualified personnel to perform the necessary work, and the City Council finds that performance of this contract is in the public interest because of economy and services under this contract will be temporary; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the performance of this contract shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive service; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** that the City Administrator is hereby authorized to increase the construction contract with Star Construction, Inc., to add the construction of a new landscaped soundwall, and to increase the contract in the amount of three hundred sixty two thousand dollars (\$362,000.00), for a total contract amount of one million five hundred sixty two thousand dollars (\$1,562,000.00) to cover the additional improvements; and, be it

WHEREAS, the City plans to construct a new landscaped soundwall at the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) to alleviate general blight and unsafe conditions caused by the deterioration, obsolescence and blight at Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) in the Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Oakland has authorized a contribution of \$362,000.00 including contingency to the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park Project; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Redevelopment Agency entered into a Cooperation Agreement on July 1, 2004, which generally governs the provision of assistance and the payment of funds between the two agencies, including Redevelopment Agency financial contributions and other assistance to support City public improvements; and

WHEREAS, Section 33445 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes a redevelopment agency to pay for the installation cost or construction of publicly owned facilities, if the legislative body has consented to such funding and has made certain findings; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council hereby consents to the use of up to \$362,000.00 in Redevelopment Agency funds, for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park Project, and appropriates such funds to the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park Project; and be it further

**RESOLVED**: That a total of \$362,000.00 will be deposited and appropriated to City's Oakland Redevelopment Agency Fund (7780), Project Delivery Organization (92270), in a project to be established for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park Project; and be it further

#### **RESOLVED:** That the City Council hereby finds and determines as follows:

- 1. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CONTRIBUTION AND ALLOCATION OF REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY FUNDS TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND UNDER THE COOPERATION AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$362,000 FOR THE CARTER GILMORE SPORTS COMPLEX (FORMERLY KNOWN AS GREENMAN FIELD) RENOVATION AND COMMUNITY PARK PROJECT FROM FY 2006-2007 COLISEUM REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AREA FUNDS

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency wishes to fund construction costs for the new landscaped sound wall to be located at the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) in the Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland and Redevelopment Agency are implementing the 2005-2007 Agency Budget for the Coliseum Redevelopment Project, including the Coliseum Area Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park Project, to accommodate new development and improve the residential edge of the Coliseum Project Area; and

WHEREAS, the community has requested a soundwall because the baseball fields and new community park are located directly behind several residential homes that are adjacent to the project; and

WHEREAS, the sound wall will provide a permanent decorative structure that will benefit the community by decreasing the noise from the baseball games and the new community park; and

**WHEREAS**, the project is consistent with and will further the purposes of the Coliseum Redevelopment Plan and its Five-Year Implementation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Agency wishes to support these activities by allocating \$362,000.00 from FY 2006-2007 Coliseum Redevelopment Agency Fund (9450), Coliseum Redevelopment Organization (88659), Coliseum Staff project (S82600); and

WHEREAS, the City and Redevelopment Agency entered into a Cooperation Agreement on July 1, 2004, which generally governs the provision of assistance and the payment of funds between the two agencies, including Redevelopment Agency financial contributions and other assistance to support City public improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Agency will contribute and transfer these Agency tax increment funds to the City for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project; and

WHEREAS, Section 33445 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes a redevelopment agency to pay for the installation cost or construction of publicly-owned facilities, if the legislative body has consented to such funding and has made certain findings; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is consenting to the use of Agency funding for the project pursuant to Section 33445 of the California Health and Safety Code; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the Agency hereby authorizes the use of up to \$362,000.00 in Redevelopment Agency funds, for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project, and allocates such funds to the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project; and be it further

**RESOLVED**: That a total of \$362,000 Agency funds will be transferred from Coliseum Operations Fund (9450), Coliseum Redevelopment Organization (88659), Coliseum Staff Project (S82600) to the City's Redevelopment Agency Fund (7780), Project Delivery Organization (92270), in a project to be established for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project; and be it further

**RESOLVED**: That the Agency hereby finds and determines as follows:

- That the funding of the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project will benefit the Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area by the construction of a new landscaped sound wall to alleviate the substandard, unsafe conditions which are a blighting influence in the Coliseum Project Area;
- 2. That the City's Capital Improvement Program ("CIP") funds have been unable to provide financing for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project in the period 2006-2007 and that no other reasonable means of financing the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project are available to the City other than Redevelopment Agency funding;

- 3. That the use of tax increment funds from the Coliseum Project Area for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project will assist in elimination of crime and blight in the Coliseum Project Area with the construction of a new landscaped sound wall; and
- 4. That the use of tax increment funds from the Coliseum Project Area for the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex (formerly known as Greenman Field) Renovation and Community Park project is consistent with the implementation plan adopted for the Coliseum Project Area.

and be it further

**RESOLVED:** That the Agency Administrator or her designee is authorized to take any other action with respect to this project and Agency funding consistent with this Resolution and its basic purpose.
