Resolution Confirming The Report Of Assessment For The Abatement Of Dangerous And Insanitary Building Sewer Conditions Throughout The City of

Oakland

#### **SUMMARY**

A resolution has been prepared to confirm the Report of Assessment for the abatement of dangerous and insanitary building sewers pursuant to Section 13.08.280 of the Oakland Municipal Code (OMC); and to allow the City to transfer to the Alameda County Tax Roll for the collection of delinquent payments associated with costs incurred for abating dangerous and insanitary sewer laterals.

Five (5) properties are delinquent in payments totaling \$36,638.32 (see Attachment A). The owners of the five (5) properties signed a voluntary agreement to complete required work on their sewer lateral, but failed to perform the work. The City hired and paid contractors that performed the abatement. The property owners failed to reimburse the City for the costs incurred. The current amount due includes all contractors' costs, administrative fees, and interest accrued.

In accordance with Section 13.08.280, and 13.08.320 of the OMC, this shall constitute a special assessment against the real property abated.

Staff recommends that the resolution be approved.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Pending Council approval of this resolution, a special assessment will be placed on the properties to recover all construction and administrative costs incurred by the City. The combined total to be assessed against the properties, including fees and interest, is \$36,638.32 and will be collected with the 2007-08 property taxes. The cost of all work to date has been paid by the City from the Sewer Service Fund (3100). The assessment will reimburse the City for costs incurred in the abating of these private building sewers and the recoveries will be placed back into the Sewer Service Fund.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Overflows from private sanitary sewer laterals present a threat to public health and safety. The Public Works Agency is responsible for ensuring that the respective owners of these laterals abate these conditions. When the City incurs costs to abate these overflows, the property owners are responsible for reimbursement of these costs to the City. The procedure for mandatory sewer abatement provides for the Council to confirm or overrule the findings of the Director of the Public Works Agency after an administrative hearing on each abatement.

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The combined total to be assessed, including fees and interest, is \$36,638.32. The assessment will be collected with the 2007-08 property taxes. All work to date has been paid for by the City. The assessment will reimburse the City for costs incurred in abating these private building sewers. Since an extensive hearing process has already occurred, it is not necessary for the Council to conduct an additional formal hearing. The report has been posted in the City Clerk's Office and a copy sent to the affected property owners specifying the cost of abatement for each parcel to be assessed. The OMC requires the Council to confirm or overrule the decision of the Director of the Public Works Agency. If protest arises on any particular property, staff will meet with the property owner to resolve the matter.

The resolution confirms the report and directs the assessments to be filed with the County Auditor. The cost of this work will constitute a special assessment with the 2007-08 property taxes.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic:</u> This program will provide maintenance opportunities for local businesses and workers.

<u>Environmental</u>: The program will help improve water quality in the Bay and connecting waterways, and prevent contamination of streets, sidewalks, and the environment.

<u>Social Equity:</u> Property owners throughout the City, who have defective sewer lines, will benefit from this program.

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

This section is not applicable. This resolution pertains to the assessment of monies due to the City and does not have any concerns dealing with disability and senior citizen accessibility.
