I was appointed by CM Bas to serve on the Reimagining Public Safety technical advisory task force (legal challenges and opportunities) in which I worked closely with other members (some of whom are on this commission) in developing specific public safety and violence prevention policies and investment approaches oriented around engaging and further developing the neighborhood councils. In doing this work I also connected with several CPAB members on developing specific neighborhood council approaches and policies. My professional experience is in community-level planning and engagement and health equity policy research. I have a demonstrated long-standing interests in developing and advocating policies (especially involving community engagement, youth education, workforce development, built environment participatory actions/place-making) that advance resident engagement and help create environments that support community health and on-going participation. I have served on prior commissions such as the County Public Health Commission in which my my focus has been a community health and equity lens in addressing systemic social and policy issues within Oakland. Finally, I have also worked in the past (15-years) for the City of Oakland in delivering neighborhood revitalization projects and programs and have developed deep relations and first-hand experiences with neighborhoods and communities across the City's flatlands including Deep East Oakland, Foothill/Seminary, Elmhurst, Fruitvale, Dimond, West Oakland, and Golden Gate. INTRODUCED BY MAYOR SHENG THAO

RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF DAVID RALSTON AS A MEMBER OF THE COMMUNITY POLICING ADVISORY BOARD

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 72727 C.M.S., adopted June 11, 1996, and amended by Resolution No. 73916 C.M.S., adopted November 4, 1997 (which changed the Community Policing Advisory Board's status from a Task Force to a Board), established that the Community Policing Advisory Board shall oversee, monitor and report at least twice yearly and provide recommendations on community policing to the Mayor, City Council, City Manager, and director of Police Services; and

WHEREAS, the Community Policing Advisory Board consists of fifteen (15) members, all Oakland residents, serving three-year terms, three appointed by the Mayor, one by each Councilmember, one by the Oakland Housing Authority, one by the Oakland Unified School District Board, and two by the Home Alert Steering Committee; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Nikki Fortunato Bas has recommended the appointment of David Ralston; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Sheng Thao has appointed David Ralston to serve a three year term, subject to confirmation by the City Council; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby confirms the appointment of **David Ralston**, to serve a three year term as the District 2 representative on the Community Policing Advisory Board beginning March 25, 2024 and ending March 24, 2027, filling the vacant seat previously held by Colette McPherson.
