RE: A Follow-Up Report From the Parking Division Comparing Oakland's Parking

Violation Fines with Other Cities

SUMMARY

At the April 7, 2009 meeting, the Finance and Management Committee directed staff to return with a comparison of Oakland's Parking Violation Fines to those of other cities. Staff's analysis is included in *Attachment A*.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is an informational report. Fiscal impacts are not included.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Comparison of Fines

Staff conducted an assessment of parking violation fines for seven cities in order to compare Oakland's parking violation fines with these municipalities. Most of San Francisco's parking violation fines are higher than Oakland's fines. The comparison of fines is provided in *Attachment A*. Please note: (1) \$10.00 of each Oakland's fine is passed through to Alameda County as a surcharge. (2) Fee increases are proposed for FY 09-11, as presented in *Attachment A*.

Pursuant to the provision of the California Constitution and the State of California Section 40203.5(a), the City of Oakland is authorized to set its schedule of parking penalties for parking violations and late payment penalties.

Possible Fine Reductions

Typically parking violation fines are set high enough to deter parking violators from violating a city's parking codes and regulations. Reducing parking violation fines could encourage violations and have a negative impact on the availability of parking spaces in commercial areas.

Lack of available parking spaces in the commercial areas also may turn away potential customers due to inconvenience in locating a parking space.

Staff conducted an analysis of the effect of reducing the parking fines by \$5.00 for the top 20 issued parking violations to determine what the potential impact on revenues would be.

As shown in Chart 1 below, the potential impact of a \$5.00 reduction in parking fines would be \$1,191,502.00 annually. The current rate of fine collection is approximately 64%. Citations that are not paid within 63 days are referred for further collections to Law Enforcement Systems (the collection agency), Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and Franchise Tax Board (FTB).
