ORDINANCE 1) AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2025-26 INCREASE IN THE RATE OF PROPERTY TAX IMPOSED BY VOTER-APPROVED MEASURES; AND 2) FIXING THE RATE OF THE PROPERTY TAX AND LEVYING A TAX ON REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-26 FOR THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RETENTION ACT OF 1997 (MEASURE M), THE PARAMEDIC SERVICES ACT OF 1997 (MEASURE N), THE LIBRARY SERVICES RETENTION AND ENHANCEMENT ACT (MEASURE C), THE OAKLAND COMMUNITY VIOLENCE REDUCTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (MEASURE NN), THE 2018 OAKLAND PUBLIC LIBRARY PRESERVATION ACT (MEASURE D), THE 2020 OAKLAND PARKS AND RECREATION PRESERVATION, LITTER REDUCTION, HOMELESSNESS SUPPORT ACT (MEASURE Q), THE CHILDREN'S INITIATIVE OF 2018 (MEASURE AA), THE 2022 OAKLAND ZOO ANIMAL CARE, EDUCATION AND IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE (MEASURE Y), AND THE WILDFIRE PREVENTION FINANCING ACT OF 2024 (MEASURE MM)

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland must annually set the property tax levy rates and inform the County of Alameda of these rates by August 10th for inclusion on that year's property tax bill for the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act of 1997 (Measure M), the Paramedic Services Act of 1997 (Measure N), the Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act (Measure C), the Oakland Community Violence Reduction and Emergency Response Act (Measure NN), the 2018 Oakland Public Library Preservation Act (Measure D), the 2020 Oakland Parks and Recreation Preservation, Litter Reduction and Homelessness Support Act (Measure Q), the Children's Initiative of 2018 (Measure AA), the 2022 Oakland Zoo Animal Care, Education and Improvement Ordinance (Measure Y), and the Wildfire Prevention Financing Act of 2024 (Measure MM); and

WHEREAS, adoption of this ordinance will allow the City to increase the rates as allowed by the measures, and levy and collect the Fiscal Year 2025-26 revenues included in the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Proposed Policy Budget related to Measures M, N, D, AA, Q, C, Y, MM, and NN; and

WHEREAS, in 1997 the voters of Oakland approved Measure M, which imposed a special tax to fund emergency medical services on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and provided that beginning in Fiscal

Year 1998-99 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax, but not by more than five percent of the tax rates imposed in the immediately preceding fiscal year, only upon a finding that the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown on the Consumer Price Index (“CPI”) for all items, has increased since the 1997 index year; and

WHEREAS, in 1997 the voters of Oakland approved Measure N, which imposed a special tax to fund paramedic emergency services on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and provided that beginning in Fiscal Year 2000-01 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax, but not by more than five percent of the tax rates imposed in the immediately preceding fiscal year, only upon a finding that the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown on the CPI for all items, has increased since the 1997 index year; and

WHEREAS, in 2018 the voters of Oakland approved Measure D, which imposes a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and provides that beginning in Fiscal Year 2019-20 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax annually by an amount not to exceed the greater of the increases in 1) the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown on the CPI for all items, using 2018 as the index year, or 2) the California per Capita Personal Income as determined by the California Department of Finance using Fiscal Year 2018-19 as the index year; and

WHEREAS, In 2018, sixty-two percent of Oakland voters approved Measure AA, which imposes a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the measure, and provides beginning Fiscal Year 2020-21 and each year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the parcel tax by making one of the following findings: (1) the percentage change in cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as determined by the U.S. Department of Labor has increased, or (2) the California per Capita Personal Income, as determined by the California Department of Finance, has increased using Fiscal Year 2019-20 as the index year; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, the voters of Oakland approved Measure Q, which imposes a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and this tax provides that beginning in Fiscal Year 2021-22 and each year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax by a percentage that is up to the greater of: (1) the percentage change in cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as determined by the twelve-month Annual Percentage Change in the CPI for all items, or (2) the percentage change in the California per Capita Personal Income, as determined by the California Department of Finance using Fiscal Year 2020-21 as the index year; and

WHEREAS, in 2022 the voters of Oakland approved Measure C, which renewed the Measure Q Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act of 2004, through June 30, 2052 imposing this special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and allowing the City Council, beginning in Fiscal Year 2023-2024, to increase the tax annually by the greater of the increases in 1) the percentage change in the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown on the CPI for all items, using 2022 as the index year, or 2) the percentage change in California per Capita Personal Income as determined by the California Department of Finance using Fiscal Year 2022-

23 as the index year, but in no event may the annual tax rate adjustments increase by more than five percent of the rates imposed in the immediately preceding fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, in 2022 the voters of Oakland approved Measure Y, which imposes a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and provides that beginning in Fiscal Year 2024-25 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax annually by an amount not to exceed the greater of: 1) the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown on the CPI for all items, using 2023 as the index year, or 2) the California per Capita Personal Income as determined by the California Department of Finance using Fiscal Year 2023-24 as the index year; and

WHEREAS, in 2024 the voters of Oakland approved Measure MM, which imposes a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, and provides that beginning in Fiscal Year 2026-27 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax by a percentage equal to the greater of: 1) the percentage change in the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as determined by the twelve-month Annual Percentage Change in the CPI for all items in the San Francisco Bay Area as published by the U.S. Department of Labor Statistics, or 2) the percentage change in the California per Capita Personal Income as determined by the California Department of Finance and shown in the Price Factor and Population Information Report issued annually, but in no event may the annual tax rate adjustments increase by more than five percent of the rates imposed in the immediately preceding fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, in 2024 the voters of Oakland passed Measure NN, which imposes a special parcel tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by the ordinance, to fund police services, fire services, and violence intervention services, and provides that beginning in Fiscal Year 2025-26 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax up to the percentage change in the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as determined by the twelve-month Annual Percentage Change in the CPI for all items in the San Francisco Bay Area as published by the U.S. Department of Labor statistics; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council hereby finds that the Consumer Price Index for all items in the San Francisco Bay Area was 339.050 for calendar year 2023 and 348.417 for calendar year 2024. Thus, the cost-of-living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all items, has increased 2.8 percent from calendar year 2023 to calendar year 2024 and the change in California per Capita Personal Income as determined by the California Department of Finance between 2023 and 2024 was 3.6 percent and such increases as set forth in the Ordinance conform to these increases.

Section 2. Effective July 1, 2025 the Measures M and N special tax rates upward adjustments shall be 2.8 percent and the Measures C, D, Q, AA, and Y special tax rates upward adjustments shall be 3.6 percent.

Section 3. Effective July 1, 2025 the following rates shall be levied for Fiscal Year 2025-26 for Measures M, N, C, NN, D, Q, AA, Y, and MM as noted below by Measure and parcel type:

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Chapter. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that one or more other sections, subsections, clauses, or phrases may be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately on final adoption if it receives six or more affirmative votes; otherwise, it shall become effective upon the seventh day after final adoption.
