## RE: REVIEW OF THE MAYOR'S 2019 SALARY AS REQUIRED BY THE CITY CHARTER

Dear President Kaplan and Members of the City Council:

## PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The Oakland City Charter requires a salary review of the Oakland Mayor's salary every odd numbered year. Specifically, Oakland City Charter, Article III, Section 300, states:
"..the salary shall be set by the Council, which shall be not less than $70 \%$ nor more than $90 \%$ of the average salaries of City Managers'/Chief Executive Officers [emphasis added] of California cities within the three immediate higher and the three immediate lower cities in population to Oakland. The Mayor's salary shall be reviewed by the City Council in odd-numbered years and may be adjusted by the Council as provided for herein."

## SURYEY RESUETS

Exhibit 1 below shows the salaries of the City Managers'/Chief Executive Officers in the three California cities (Fresno, Sacramento, Long Beach) with populations higher than Oakland's population of 425,195 , and the three cities (Bakersfield, Anaheim, Santa Ana) with populations lower than Oakland.


As exhibit 1 above shows, the average annual salary of the City Managers'/Chief Executive Officers in the six cities surveyed is $\$ 278,945$. The City Charter requires the Oakland Mayor's salary be within $70 \%-90 \%$ of the average, or $\$ 195,261-\$ 251,050$. The Mayor's current salary is $\$ 203,000$ and is within the Charter's requirements.
