#### **SUMMARY**

At the September 12, 2006 Community and Economic Development Committee meeting, staff was directed to prepare a Supplemental Agenda Report on the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME, Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS and Emergency Shelter Grant Programs Performance for the Year 2005-2006. The report provides information on CDBG funds allocated to Economic Development in the Year 2005-2006.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

There are no fiscal impacts associated with this informational report.

#### **KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS**

The FY 2005-2006 CDBG budget for Economic Development programs was \$2,735,316. Of this amount, \$2,149,559 was allocated to the City's Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization Program, Business Development and Commercial Lending. The remaining amount of \$585,757 was allocated to contractors for economic development programs.

Attachment A provides a breakdown of the \$2,735,316 of CDBG funds allocated to Economic Development in FY 2005-2006.
