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#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Receive An Annual Report Of The Oakland Youth Advisory Commission For Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-2017.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Oakland Youth Advisory Commission (OYAC) Annual Report is a summary of the activities, accomplishments and policy issues that OYAC has focused on in 2016-2017. The information within this report is intended to catalyze and increase interaction between youth commissioners and elected officials.

The Youth Leadership Development Coordinator position (Program Analyst I) was filled in December 2016 to support the Youth Commission. The early period of 2017 was then dedicated to team building, training in city government and youth action leadership, and a two-day strategic planning retreat, which included participation in the Women's March of February 18, 2017.

During their regular meetings, Commissioners met with staff from the Office of the Mayor, as well as multiple City departments and community based organizations to identify collaborative partnership opportunities and to learn more about the strengths, gaps and challenges of youth focused programming in the city. The Commission built consensus and unanimously voted to support policy measures related to tobacco control and the sugar sweetened beverage tax by writing letters of support and testifying before the Life Enrichment Committee.

Commissioners also participated in a youth-led research action planning process to identify highest priority areas of focus; youth immigrant rights and youth/ community and police relations. OYAC is currently planning an immigrant rights youth forum and working on #OYACgivesback, the youth-to-youth mini-grant component of the Oakland ReCAST Initiative. The Oakland ReCAST Initiative is designed, in part, to improve relations between law enforcement, community and youth and is funded by a grant to the Human Services Department from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA).

Dear Mayor Schaaf and Oakland City Council Members,



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




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# **OYAC Principles**

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We believe that participating in local government is one of the surest pathways to influence positive lasting change for youth our community.


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

- → Each Commissioner has joined one committee and members have developed a standard meeting schedule
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
#### **Meeting with Mayor Schaaf**

The national Women's March movement represents principles that OYAC believes in and Commissioners expressed a strong desire to lift up these principles by building community together and marching as a team!










At the beginning of this Commission year OYAC went through an extensive youth-led research action planning process to identify two high priority issue areas to focus on for project development:

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


#### **Immigrant & Refugee Youth Forum**
