Sworn Management Police Officers

SUMMARY

The City of Oakland has reached a tentative agreement on wages and other terms and conditions of employment with the Oakland Police Officers' Association Unit UN2 Sworn Management Police Officers. Key provisions include delaying a 4% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) that was part of an arbitration award in their current contract and due to start July 1, 2009. The tentative agreement delays the COLA to January 2013. Other key provisions include reducing the number of paid holidays by six for three years, adjusting patrol officers' schedule of hours, from 84 to 80 hours per pay period (at the sole discretion of the City), assumption of 2% of the employee paid member retirement contribution (EPMC) beginning January 1, 2013; and changes to the ways Shift Pay premiums are allocated. More details will be provided during the verbal presentation. The tentative agreement is currently under consideration by the OPOA membership.

FISCAL IMPACT

It is estimated that the proposed four year contract amendment would capture significant savings each year as detailed below:
