Re: Status Report on the FY 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program, through June

30, 2004

SUMMARY

This report provides the status of the City of Oakland's FY 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects through June 30, 2004. Attachment A includes all projects approved by the City Council for FY 2003-04 and in prior years, and included in the previous (FY 2002-03) CIP Status Report. This report includes 236 total projects, including three supported by the Measure DD funding. Measure DD projects are incorporated here because of their inclusion in the FY 2003-08 CIP Budget, but will be reported on more fully in the Measure DD Annual Status Report (not yet scheduled).

Projects reported are listed by CIP category, as defined in the FY 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program Budget. For each project, staff provides the initial project sponsor who can be considered the "client"; project title, number and description; funding source; project manager responsible for implementation, target completion date; FY 2003-04 adjusted budget and expenditures; project-to-date budget and spending 1; and project status as of June 30, 2004. Attachment B provides a legend of funding sources used to support the CIP projects.

FISCAL IMPACT


This report does not have a direct fiscal impact. Project balances shown in this report are supported by appropriations approved by the City Council.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2003-08 CIP began new projects and built upon initiatives outlined in the prior CIP budgets, supporting the FY 2003-05 City Council priorities to:

- Make Oakland a Safe City
- Develop a Sustainable City
- Improve Oakland Neighborhoods
- Ensure that all Oakland Youth and Seniors Have the Opportunity to be Successful

- Model Best Practices to Improve Customer Services and to be a Fiscally Sound and Efficiently Run City
- Maintain and Enhance Oakland's Physical Assets
- Inspire Creativity and Civic Engagement

The FY 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program Budget is organized into eight major categories, although the category entitled "Unfunded Requests" is not included in this report, because projects therein received no funding and thus had no activity during FY 2003-04. Further, two categories that did not appear in the FY 2003-08 CIP program are nonetheless presented in this report, because they contain active projects funded in prior years. Specifically, Attachment A lists projects by the following categories:

Buildings and Facilities (formerly City Buildings)

The Building and Facilities category includes repairs and upgrades to community centers, city structures and leased properties. Projects in this category provide such upgrades as new fixtures, exterior lighting, and security fencing and repairs, including asbestos and lead-based paint inspection and notification, and projects to ensure health and safety code compliance. In terms of FY 2003-04 Adjusted Budget, the two largest projects in this category are the East Oakland Sports Complex construction and Studio One Art Center renovation.

Equipment (funded in prior years, but not included in the FY 2003-08 CIP Budget documents)

The primary component in the Equipment category is the capital lease for vehicle and equipment acquisitions (initially approved by the Council in FY 2001-02). Another important project is the replacement of mobile and portable radio equipment. There are also two other, smaller projects involving the purchase and installation of specialized equipment.

Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization (funded in prior years, but not included in the FY 2003-08 CIP Budget documents)

This category includes funding for MacArthur and International Streetscape projects. These projects were approved in FY 2000-01 and have provided ornamental and pedestrian lighting, crosswalks and bulb-outs, street furniture, and public art along two of the City's primary corridors.

Parks and Open Space (formerly Parks and Recreation)

Funding for Parks and Open Space projects reflects the City's substantial commitment to facility improvements throughout Oakland's parks system, providing support to such projects as the Bella Vista Park, Temescal Pool filtration replacement, Greenman Field renovation, Oakland Zoo, Peralta Hacienda Historical Park and Union Point Park. In addition, miscellaneous acquisitions of open space are supported within this category. Funding has also been provided for tennis and basketball court resurfacing, playground

Item #_____ Finance & Mgmt Committee October 26, 2004 equipment replacement, landscaping and environmental studies and general park renovation.

Sewers and Storm Drains

These projects include rehabilitation of sewer mains throughout the City as required by the infiltration/inflow (I/I) correction program. A Cease and Desist Order issued to the City of Oakland and other Bay Area communities requires that the City plan and implement management practices and capital repairs and replacements to the aging sewer facilities to prevent sewage discharges into creeks, area lakes, and the San Francisco Bay. Funding for emergency repair and replacement of sewer and some limited storm drain facilities has been included in this category. Funding has also been provided for the repayment of existing loans through the State Regional Water Quality Control Board.

Streets and Sidewalks

This category includes street resurfacing, street safety improvements, widening of various streets, including construction of curb ramps for disabled access, enhanced street lighting, and sidewalk repairs. In addition to ongoing street and sidewalk repair work, several special projects have also been funded. Some projects, such as hazardous material removal, have positioned the City to leverage federal and state grant program funds. Funds have also been included for local match grant requirements. In addition, funding has been provided for several "gateway" projects that enhance both the appearance and function of the streets and sidewalks in the project areas. Funding for emergency roadway repairs and special pedestrian safety projects has also been included. The largest component of the street and sidewalk category is street resurfacing, which currently keeps City streets on an 85-year repaving cycle.

Traffic Improvements (formerly Traffic Signals)

This category includes installation of new traffic signals, modernization of traffic signals and signal controllers, and signal synchronization. The Traffic Improvements category also includes annual funding for traffic studies, as well as analyses and implementation of various traffic safety measures and traffic calming strategies.

Technology Enhancements

Projects in this category include computer upgrades for the Oakland Public Library and CEDA building inspectors; enhancements and upgrades of existing City systems; and citywide network and server system enhancements. A key project in this category is the purchase of an emergency warning siren system and equipment.

Miscellaneous

The Miscellaneous category includes funding of the City's federally mandated ADA Transition Plan (physical access improvements) and ADA Accommodations Program (employment and programmatic access accommodations). Also included is discretionary capital improvement funding for the Mayor and each City Council member, which address specific district priorities and support larger citywide projects (i.e., "pay-go" funds).

DISCUSSION

Summary of Spending

The Capital Improvement Program has been an aggressive undertaking. Staff has worked diligently on projects approved as part of the FY 2003-08 CIP Budget, as well as those from prior years.

<u>Table 1</u> below summarizes and compares the FY 2003-04 Adjusted Budget to FY 2003-04 Year-to-Date Expenditures. <u>Table 2</u> compares Project-to-Date (PTD) Budget to PTD Expenditures. <u>Table 1</u> describes adjusted appropriations and actual spending that occurred through FY 2003-04, while <u>Table 2</u> provides the lifetime project appropriation and spending.² Both tables provide data by category.

Generally, the level of spending for most CIP projects starts out low and increases as the construction phase is implemented. While Percent Expended gives a true financial picture, it is not a true indicator of project status. For most projects, up to 80 percent of the total project appropriation is associated with actual construction. These funds must be available prior to advertising for public bids on such projects. Since the bid and award process may be up to five months long and the construction period another four to twelve months, on average, project appropriations are typically not fully expended in the fiscal year in which they are appropriated. Also, the Percent Expended is dependent upon the actual construction cost. If bids are under the budgeted amount, the net savings will also decrease the percent expended.

Summary and Highlights of Project Progress

Buildings and Facilities

- Studio One Art Center Expansion and Rehabilitation: Space planning is nearly complete, with design work scheduled for completion in summer of 2005.
- Henry J. Kaiser Convention Center: Painting of the ballroom and construction of the rebuilt kitchen are scheduled for completion in fall 2004.

Equipment

 Museum Workshop Dust Collection Equipment: Installation of OSHA-approved equipment will begin once notice to proceed is issued in October 2004, and will be completed by January 2005.

Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization

- NCR Miscellaneous Improvements: Bulb-out construction on upper Grand Avenue and general streetscaping improvements on Millsmont/MacArthur are complete, while Laurel/MacArthur Avenue streetscaping improvements are underway.
- MacArthur and International Streetscape Project: Portions of these project have been completed. Work on MacArthur includes undergrounding and is scheduled to begin later this year. Work on International will begin once utility undergrounding (expected in 2006) commences.

Parks and Open Space

- Greenman Field Renovation: Funds from a California Parks and Recreation Grant have been used to support design work on this ball field improvement project.
- Miscellaneous Acquisitions: Staff's major focus in FY 2003-04 was to identify and complete remaining acquisitions of shoreline open space using Measure K funding. As of June 30, 2004, staff of the Public Works Agency and CEDA's Real Estate unit were in negotiations for the Crowley site.
- Peralta Hacienda Historical Park: Also funded by the Measure K bond fund, improvements to the Hacienda Historical Park are currently in the final design phase. Construction is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2005.

Sewers and Storm Drains

Various sewer projects: Construction on many large sewer rehabilitation projects

 including the San Pablo Avenue Area Sewer Rehabilitation, Main Lake Sewer from Mandela Parkway to Poplar Street Sewer Relief and the School Street, Rhoda, Steinmentz and Maple Sewer Rehabilitation – has been completed.
 Design work on other large projects, such as those with FY 2003-04 Adjusted Budgets greater than \$2 million, is substantially completed, with the majority of construction bids planned for the fall of 2004 through spring of 2005.

Streets and Sidewalks

- Citywide Sidewalk Repair: Construction to repair damaged sidewalks that are the
 responsibility of the City is ongoing. An inventory of all sidewalks in Oakland is
 planned to begin soon. These projects receive support from a variety of sources,
 including the Municipal Improvement Capital, Measure B ACTA and ACTIA,
 and federal grant funds. Construction for most finite projects (e.g. those actually
 scheduled for repair) is already underway and will be completed by June 2005;
 others anticipate going to bid in the fall of 2004.
- Street Rehabilitation / Resurfacing: Construction on the majority of prior year street rehabilitation / resurfacing projects is completed; however, the project funded through Measure B is projected for completion in June 2005.

Technology Enhancements

- New Permit and Code Enforcement Tracking System: Staff is currently renegotiating the scope of work and total project cost for the new system with the selected vendor.
- KTOP Capital Improvements or Enhancements: Work on this project was delayed until other planning and design work was completed. Completion of project is expected in June 2005.

- Oracle License and Support: This contract provides support and maintenance for the City's Oracle applications (Financials and Human Resources) and will end in June 2008.
- Replace and Upgrade Computer-Aided Dispatch System: Implementation of the Fire Department's updated dispatch system is nearly complete and is expected to be fully operational by the beginning of FY 2005-06.

Traffic Improvements

- Citywide Pedestrian Safety Projects: A design agreement for installation of pedestrian signal heads at over 50 intersections is in progress; completion of design is set for July 2005.
- Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program: Various projects for constructing traffic circles, barriers and other traffic calming devices are ongoing throughout the city.

Miscellaneous

- ADA Transition Plan: Project funding helps to provide accessible City facilities by removing architectural barriers identified in the City's ADA Transition Plan. During FY 2003-04, Bella Vista Park, Joaquin Miller Playground and other curb ramp projects received funding and were completed.
- Council and Mayoral Pay-Go: Traditional pay-go allocations from the Municipal Improvement Capital fund allow City Council members and the Mayor to fund supplemental and discretionary capital improvement projects within their districts, as well as citywide. For fiscal years 2003-04 and 2004-05, Council approved additional pay-go appropriations (for Council members only) to fund neighborhood transportation projects using State Gas Tax and Measure B funds.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

There are no direct sustainable opportunities associated with this report.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR ACCESS

There are no direct disability and senior access opportunities associated with this report. However, several projects discussed in the report provide a direct benefit to the City for improving access to City facilities, services, and programs for persons with disabilities.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council accept this report.
