RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO SUBMIT SUGAR-SWEETENED BEVERAGE TAX FUNDING REQUESTS FOR FISCAL YEARS 2018-2019 AND 2019-2021 TO THE SUGAR-SWEETENED BEVERAGE COMMUNITY ADVISORY BOARD AND THEN AFTER REVIEW OF THESE SUBMITTED REQUESTS, THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL SEND ITS FULL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FY 2018-2019 AND FY 2019-2021 TO COUNCIL IN MAY 2019

WHEREAS, the voters of Oakland overwhelmingly adopted Measure HH-the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Ordinance by over 62%, in November 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Ordinance (the "Ordinance") approved a 1 cent per ounce general excise tax on the distribution of sugar-sweetened beverages in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance established the Community Advisory Board (the "Board") to advise and make recommendations on how and to what extent the City Council should establish and/or fund programs to prevent or reduce the health consequences of the consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages in Oakland communities; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 87062, established the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Tax Sub-fund within the General Fund and determined that the Oakland Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution taxes shall be appropriated by the Oakland City Council only after the recommendations of the Board, regarding the expenditure of general fund revenues for programs that prevent or reduce the health consequences of consuming sugar-sweetened beverages are received, reviewed and considered by the Oakland City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Board's membership was confirmed by resolution in June 2017 and began holding regular meetings in October 2017; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is directed to submit sugar-sweetened beverage tax funding requests for Fiscal Years 2018-2019 and 2019-2021 to the Board and then after review of these submitted requests, the Board shall send its full recommendations for FY 2018-2019 and FY 2019-2021 to Council in May 2019.

RESOLUTION NO. 87062 C.M.S.

Introduced by Vice Mayor Campbell Washington and City Councilmember Kaplan

RESOLUTION PROVIDING 1) THAT A NEW SEPARATE ACCOUNT SHALL BE ESTABLISHED WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND TO HOLD GENERAL TAX REVENUES GENERATED BY THE OAKLAND SUGAR-SWEETENED BEVERAGE DISTRIBUTION TAX, AND 2) DETERMINING THAT THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL NOT APPROPRIATE SUGAR-SWEETENED BEVERAGE DISTRIBUTION TAX REVENUES PRIOR TO RECEIVING AND CONSIDERING THE COMMUNITY ADVISORY BOARD'S RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING APPROPRIATION OF THE GENERAL FUND REVENUES, AND 3) PROVIDING THAT THE TAX REVENUES SHALL BE HELD IN THE SUBFUND UNTIL COMPLETION OF THIS APPROPRIATION PROCESS.

WHEREAS, the Voters of Oakland overwhelmingly adopted Measure HH by over 62%, in November 2016; and

WHEREAS, the passage of Measure HH established the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution tax in Oakland, imposing a 1 cent per ounce general tax on the distributors of sugar-sweetened beverages; and

WHEREAS, Measure HH requires the City Council to establish a nine-member Community Advisory Board with specific membership requirements, and established that the Board would be responsible for publishing an annual report that includes the following: "1) Recommendations on how to allocate the City's general funds to reduce the consumption of sugar sweetened beverages in Oakland and to address the results of such consumption; 2) How and to what extent the City Council and Mayor have implemented the recommendations presented by the Board; 3) Information, if available, concerning the impact of this Chapter on the public health of the residents of the City; and 4) Any additional information that the Panel deems appropriate"; and

WHEREAS, within 15 days of publication, the Board's annual report is transmitted to the City Council by the City Administrator; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Oakland City Council finds and determines that it is necessary to establish a separate account to hold General Fund Tax revenues received from the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax until they are appropriated by the City Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or her designee is directed to establish a new subfund within the General Fund Group, designated as the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Fund ("the Fund"), and to deposit all general tax revenue received from the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax into the Fund; and

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Oakland City Council, hereby amends the Fiscal Year 2017-19 budget to deposit all general tax revenue received from the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax into the Fund for future appropriation; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Oakland City Council finds and determines that the Oakland Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distributor taxes shall be appropriated by the Oakland City Council only after the recommendations of the Board, regarding the expenditure of general fund revenues for programs that prevent or reduce the health consequences of consuming sugar-sweetened beverages received, reviewed and considered by the Oakland City Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Oakland City Council directs the City Administration to timely provide the Board with staffing and resources to properly function to be funded by the Sugar Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Fund; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That any Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax revenues received in any fiscal year but not expended that year, shall be carried forward into the next fiscal year to be used based on and/or according to the recommendations contained in the annual report of the Board to the extent approved by the Oakland City Council.
