RESOLUTION DECLARING JUNE 1, 2006 AS SILENCE THE VIOLENCE DAY IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND

WHEREAS neighborhood violence is a growing concern for Oakland residents; and

WHEREAS the citizens of Oakland want an end to the violence that is devastating our communities; and

WHEREAS, according to 2000 census data, homicide was the leading cause of death among Oakland residents ages 15 - 34 (49% of deaths for those ages 15-24 and 28% for those ages 25-34); and

WHEREAS according to 2000 census data, homicide was also the leading cause of death for Alameda County residents ages 15-24 (32.4% of the deaths in this age group); and

WHEREAS Oakland's current murder rate is twice as high as it was at this time last year; and

WHEREAS the City of Oakland has an opportunity to take a proactive stand in calling for an end to this violence; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Oakland City Council does hereby declare June 1, 2006 as Silence the Violence Day, setting the tone for a Summer of Non-Violence and a non-violent future for the City of Oakland; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Oakland will commemorate Silence the Violence Day with a three-minute citywide moment of silence at 11:00 a.m. in honor of those who have died or been victimized by violence in Oakland; and be it
