RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION, ACCEPTANCE AND APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION HABITAT CONSERVATION COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS: BROOKLYN BASIN, IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO-HUNDRED THIRTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$232,000) AND 66<sup>th</sup> AVENUE GATEWAY, IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO-HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000)

WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have enacted the California Wildlife Protection Act of 1990, which provides funds to the State of California for grants to local agencies to acquire and/or develop facilities for public recreational and fish and wildlife habitat protection purposes; and

WHEREAS, the State Department of Parks and Recreation has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of a portion of the program within the State, setting up necessary procedures governing application by local agencies under the program; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the State Department of Parks and Recreation require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications before submission of said applications to the State; and

WHEREAS, said applications contain assurances that the applicant must comply with; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland will enter into an agreement with the State of California for development of the projects; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: that the Oakland City Council approves the filing of applications for the Habitat Conservation Fund Grant Program under the California Wildlife Protection Act of 1990 State grant assistance for the following projects: \$232,000 for Brooklyn Basin, and \$250,000 for 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue Gateway, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: that if the applications are approved, the City Manager is authorized to accept and appropriate funds consistent with the approved funding levels; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: that City of Oakland understands the assurances and certification in the application form; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: that the City of Oakland will have available, prior to commencement of any work on the projects, the required match and sufficient funds to operate and maintain the projects; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: that the City Manager, or her appointee, as agent of the City, will conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned projects; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Office of the City Attorney shall approve all related contracts for to form and legality; and a copies will be placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.


