
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
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
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Citywide Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



Citywide ShotSpotter Activations 01 January to 30 September






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
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


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Area 1 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



•Robberies, shootings, homicides, and burglaries remain priorities of focus for Area 1

•Since the beginning of 2024, total Part 1 crimes in Area 1 have decreased 41% from 2023. Homicides are down 38%. There has been a 25% decrease in firearms related aggravated assaults in Area 1 and an overall 58% decrease in burglaries compared to 2023.

There has been a 22% decrease in robberies in 2024 compared to 2023.
Area 1 robberies, shootings and burglaries (commercial and auto) are being addressed through collaboration and operations conducted with our Special Resources Section, Ceasefire and our Criminal Investigation Division.
As part of the 2023 Crime Plan, high visibility patrols, foot patrols, traffic enforcement, and security checks will be focused throughout Area 1 and in the downtown areas such Jack London Square, Chinatown and the business districts.
Patrol Teams are directed to focus on serious and violent crime incidents through preventative patrols, collaborative community efforts, and focused enforcement and investigations.

•Patrol teams are directed to complete thorough preliminary investigations, video canvassing recovery, dissemination of intelligence, and partnering with our Special Resources Section, and working with DVP and Ceasefire strategies.

•Problem-solving projects continued to address public safety, quality of life issues, and crimes committed in the violence-concentrated areas. Additionally, the Community Resources Officers focused their efforts on Wood Street, Raimondi Park, and 2300 MLK Street Encampments. These projects emphasize prevention and conflict resolution through community partnerships in conjunction with the Encampment Management Team.

•Area 1 works regularly with the City's Encampment Management Team (ACA Harold Duffey) on encampment closures and clean ups. We recently assisted in the closure of 23/MLK, and Cypress Memorial Park.

•Our "Big Four" Detail continue to provide patrols around Kaiser, Clorox, Blue Shield and PG&E.

•Area 1 Captain continues to work with our business leaders and community groups to address various issues throughout Area 1.


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Area 2 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



Area 2 – Captain Lisa Ausmus

- Robberies and Burglaries (Commercial)continue to be the main focus of Police Area 2.
- The strategic plan for Area 2 underscores our commitment to addressing the main focus areas. It includes high visibility patrols, foot patrols, traffic enforcement, and security checks in the business districts (Valdez, Montclair, Telegraph, College, Piedmont, and San Pablo).
- Patrol teams are directed to focus on responding to 9-1-1 calls, serious and violent crime incidents:
 - Complete thorough preliminary investigations, video canvassing recovery, dissemination of intelligence, partnering with DVP and Ceasefire strategies,
 - Area 2 robberies have seen an overall decrease of 13%, as well as a decrease in commercial burglaries of 39%. Overall, crime in Area 2 is down 42%. This is due to the great work of the Special Resource Section (SRS) West team working with CID to conduct operations targeting the subjects committing these crimes.
 - The Area 2 Captain will continue to work with BID leaders and develop relationships with the community. Area 2 will utilize patrol overlaps and walking officers to create directed patrols that deter crime.


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Area 3 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



Area 3- Captain Alan Yu

- We are dedicated to collaboratively reducing incidents of gun-related violence, robberies, and human trafficking by working closely with the Department of Violence Prevention, Department of Transportation, Vice Unit, United States Marshals, FBI Task Force, and the Community to implement intelligence-driven policing strategies aimed at ensuring safety.
 - Homicides have seen a decrease of 21 percent
 - In the first quarter of 2024, robberies saw a significant increase of overall 79 percent; however, our efforts have changed the crime to a decrease of 16 percent.
- The Crime Reduction Team (CRT) have concentrated their efforts on addressing incidents of robberies and "Bipping," executing enforcement operations that have led to successful arrests of individuals associated with these crimes.
- The Community Resource Officers (CRO) have continued to work on the ongoing battle against Human Trafficking and street-level prostitution. The operational tempo have been increased to two VICE operations a week.
- CRO's have executed search warrants on gambling establishments and are working with the City Attorney's office to hold the property owners accountable.


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Area 4 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



Area 4 — A/Captain Francisco Rojas

- Shootings, robberies, and burglaries are the primary focus of Police Area 4.
- Overall, Part 1 crimes are down 17% year-to-date, reflecting the effectiveness of our ongoing initiatives.

• As part of the 2024 Strategic Plan, Patrol will be deployed in high-traffic areas within the district, including Fruitvale Village, Dimond, Lincoln Square, and the Laurel. Officers will utilize disseminated intelligence on crime patterns to conduct targeted foot patrols, traffic enforcement, and security checks. This proactive approach aims to enhance community safety and deter criminal activity.

• Area 4 will strengthen collaboration with our law enforcement partners, including the California Highway Patrol (CHP), Alameda County Sheriff's Office (ACSO), Oakland Housing Authority (OHA), and BART Police. Together, we will increase the overall law enforcement presence along key thoroughfares such as International Blvd., E. 12th St., Fruitvale Blvd, and San Leandro St., specifically targeting traffic enforcement within Area 4's High Impact Neighborhood (HIN).

Area 4 — A/Captain Francisco Rojas

• In addition, Area 4 Patrol will focus on serious and violent crimes by conducting thorough preliminary investigations, canvassing for evidence, recovering surveillance video, and disseminating gathered intelligence. Partnerships with the Department of Violence Prevention (DVP) and the Ceasefire program will be integral to our efforts to address the root causes of violence.

• To further deter crime, patrol units will be strategically deployed in identified hot spots within Area 4, particularly in areas where they can have the greatest impact. The Area 4 Captain will collaborate closely with Area 4 Business Improvement District (BID) leaders, coordinating with Foot Patrol and the Trust Building Officer to continue deterring crime within our shopping districts.

• This comprehensive strategy aims not only to reduce crime rates but also to foster a safer and more vibrant community for all residents and visitors in Area 4.


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Area 5 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



Area 5 – Captain Kevin Kaney

- Area 5's main focus is preventing violent crime, primarily Murders, Shootings, and Robberies.
- Currently Area 5 is down 52% in murders, from 21 last year at this time to 10 this year.
- Area 5 is currently down 6% in Aggravated Assault and 22% in Robberies.
- In response, Area 5 staff deployed the **following measures** to continue to reduce the increase in Shootings and Robberies:
 - Continued intelligence briefings to identify possible groups or gangs escalating violence.
 - Continued Patrol briefings to ensure all stakeholders have timely and relevant information of the conflicts driving the violence in Area 5.

Area 5 – Captain Kevin Kaney

- Reviewed ShotSpotter activity while gathering intelligence and deploying available resources to those areas.
- Proactive collaboration with DVP (Department of Violence Prevention) who assists with reaching out to involved parties to prevent further violence.
- Prioritized Ceasefire strategies and referrals with requests for outreach and prevention.
- Area 5 in conjunction with the Neighborhood Enhancement Services Team (NEST) have been actively working on Arroyo Viejo Park and Dolphin Mini Park. The focus has been securing these parks and continuing to keep them free of vehicles, encampments, and lighting to keep these locations clean and safe.
- Ensure quality preliminary investigations are being completed in the field and in partnership with CID (Criminal Investigations Division).



Area 6 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents 01 January to 30 September



Area 6 – Acting Captain William Febel

- Area 6's main focus is preventing violent crime and supporting local merchants with focused resource deployments.
- Currently Area 6 is experiencing an overall decrease of 46% in Part 1 Crimes.
 - Auto Burglaries are down by 81%. Compared to 2023.
 - Robberies are down 15% compared to 2023.
 - Aggravated assaults with a firearm are down 33% compared to 2023.
 - Homicides are down by 5% compared to 2023.
- In response, Area 6 staff deployed the following measures to continue to reduce violent and Part 1 Crimes:
 - Continued Data intelligence to identify possible groups or gangs escalating violence.
 - Worked closely with the SRS East Teams and Ceasefire, which will continue to focus on individuals driving the violence.
- Prioritized Ceasefire strategies and referrals with requests for outreach and prevention.
- Increased partnership with DVP (Department of Violence Prevention), who will assist with reaching out to involved parties to prevent further violence.

Area 6 – Acting Captain William Febel

- Conducted weekly meetings with all stakeholders, law enforcement partners, and city leaders including Councilmember Reid's office.
- Work with local merchants and stakeholders to conduct CPTED evaluations for long-term burglary mitigation solutions.
- Ran overtime details such as Burglary Suppression to focus on the Hegenberger and 98th Avenue corridors.
- Reviewed ShotSpotter activity while gathering intelligence and deploying available resources to those areas.
- Continue to enforce thorough preliminary investigations (Patrol Officers) while working with our Criminal Investigations Division on follow-up requests.
- Worked with Oakland Department of Public Works and the Encampment Management Policy to clean and clear unhoused encampments in accordance with City policies and the law.
- Area 6 will continue to partner with DCA DeVries and associated NEST members who are focusing on the reduction of blight, abandoned automobiles, and unhoused encampments along the International corridor from 82nd to 90th Ave with a goal of increasing quality of life and public safety in the area.

Ceasefire – Director Davis-Howard

Ceasefire conducted 237 direct communications with individuals at highest risk for violence or their family members in Q1-Q3 2024:

- 205 by custom notifications
- 32 individuals at a call-in
- 107 individuals were referred to DVP for services.

Ceasefire hosted three (3) call-in meetinga in Q1-Q3 2024.

There have been 14 community engagement events; with 7 partners.
