for the COPS Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP) Grant

SUMMARY

On March 31, 2009, the City Council authorized the acceptance and appropriation of the COPS Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP) Grant funds with Resolution No. 81894 C.M.S. The Oakland Police Department subsequently received \$19,747,117 in CHRP grant funds to retain 41.0 FTE police officers for the term of July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2012. As it has been determined that Central Services Overhead (CSO) costs are specifically disallowed by the granting agency, the Oakland Police Department has prepared a report and resolution requesting authorization for the City Administrator to waive the CSO charges in the amount of \$1,535,376.64 associated with the CHRP grant.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of this resolution will amend Resolution No. 81894 C.M.S and authorize the City Administrator to waive CHRP grant CSO charges in the amount of \$1,535,376.64. The annual breakdown is below.

BACKGROUND

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (USDOJ/COPS), COPS Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP) was issued as part of our nation's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act ("Stimulus Package"), as a means of providing funding directly to law enforcement agencies having primary law enforcement authority, to create and preserve jobs and to increase community policing capacity and crime-prevention efforts. A total of \$1 billion in grant funding was available through the USDOJ/COPS Office and of that, the Oakland Police Department received \$19,747,117 to retain 41.0 FTE police officers – the largest CHRP grant award in the nation.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The Oakland Police Department (through use of the CHRP grant funds) shall pay 41.0 FTE entry-level police officer salaries and benefits for a 36-month period; commencing July 1, 2009. The City must continue to allocate funds for recruiting any new officers, academy costs, training, salaries and benefits above entry-level, operations and maintenance costs and the full cost of retaining grant-funded officers for 12 months after the three-year grant period (Fiscal Year 2012-2013). In addition, CSO costs are specifically disallowed by the grantor and therefore the City will not be able to recover CSO charges associated with the CHRP grant.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: Approval of this legislation will allow City staff to waive the CSO charges, keeping the City of Oakland in compliance with the terms and conditions of the grant and thereby ensuring that the City of Oakland will receive the full \$19,747,117 grant award.

Environmental: There are no environmental issues associated with this report.

<u>Social Equity</u>: Approval of this resolution will ensure that the City will receive the full grant award, thereby securing the employment of 41 police officers and helping to keep the City safe from crime and the fear of crime.
