It offers intensive academic support during the school day and social-emotional (SEL) and experiential learning opportunities 3 hours/day, 5 days/week both on and off campus (career exploration and enrichment). CS will enroll 275 students across 3 Oakland Middle schools: Greenleaf Elementary, Roots International, and Westlake Middle.


