RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO AWARD GRANT AGREEMENTS FOR THE 2023-2024 CORRIDOR AMBASSADOR **PROGRAM** ORGANIZATIONS JACK LONDON IMPROVEMENT **NON-PROFIT** SPANISH SPEAKING UNITY COUNCIL OF ALAMEDA COUNTY, INC. AND BLACK CULTURAL ZONE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 AS SET FORTH IN TABLE 1 TO THIS RESOLUTION FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) TO IMMEDIATELY ENHANCE SECURITY AMBASSADOR AND PERSONNEL AND SAFETY PROGRAMS DURING THE 2023 HOLIDAY SHOPPING SEASON AND THROUGHOUT THE PROGRAM YEAR IN HIGH PRIORITY **BUSINESS** DOWNTOWN, HEGENBERGER, AND FRUITVALE, COMMERCIAL **CORRIDORS**

WHEREAS, with the coming 2023 holiday season and as the City of Oakland (City) and other employers in the downtown area continue to recover from the disruption of business closures during the Covid-19 pandemic, the City wishes to take actions to improve public safety in the downtown area and other critical business and cultural corridors of the City, such as the Downtown, Hegenberger, and Fruitvale commercial corridors; and

WHEREAS, with the rise in crime and to improve public safety, the City wishes to support community driven solutions to attract patrons, visitors and shoppers to key commercial and cultural corridors; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to enter into grant agreements with a Business Improvement District and other commercial corridor-serving non-profit organizations to provide funding to increase and improve security from a holistic, community solutions approach as part of the 2023-2024 Corridor Safety and Ambassador Program; and

WHEREAS, the grant funds will be used to immediately expand existing ambassador programs, as well as existing private security focused on commercial corridors; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the grants is available from the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24 General Purpose Fund (1010); and

WHEREAS, the FY 2023-25 adopted budget provides One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) in funding to build on this pilot launch of the Commercial Corridor Safety and Ambassador Grants and implement a comprehensive Corridor Safety Program; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to award a Commercial Corridor Safety and Ambassador Grant to the Jack London Business Improvement District, a Nonprofit Corporation, in an amount up to Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000), as set forth in Table 1 to enhance Ambassador, Safety and Security Initiatives during the holiday shopping season in neighborhood shopping areas: and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to award a Commercial Corridor Safety and Ambassador Grant to the Black Cultural Zone Community Development Corporation, a Nonprofit Corporation, an amount up to Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) as set forth in Table 1 to enhance Ambassador, Safety and Security Initiatives during the holiday shopping season; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to award a Commercial Corridor Safety and Ambassador Grant to the Spanish Speaking Unity Council of Alameda County, Inc., a Nonprofit Corporation, an amount up to Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000), as set forth in Table 1 to enhance Ambassador, Safety and Security Initiatives during the holiday shopping season; and therefore, and

WHEREAS, Economic and Workforce Development Department Staff will continue to develop a comprehensive, citywide Corridor Safety and Management program to build capacity for long-term service delivery, to strengthen and revitalize neighborhoods without displacement, and to leverage existing City resources and support for implementation in Fiscal Year 2024-2025. The initiative is modeled after successful, long-term strategies in similarly sized cities. Staff will also continue to research and design a long-term holistic Corridor Safety program by leveraging public and private investments, engage a multitude of stakeholder groups and community-based organizations and provide for authentic opportunities to build relationships with, coordinate communications amongst, and respond to the diverse needs of our neighborhood merchant community and its residents; and therefore, now be it

RESOLVED: That Administrator is authorized to negotiate, draft, execute and award grants to the Jack London Improvement District, the Spanish Speaking Unity Council of Alameda County, Inc. and the Black Cultural Zone Community Development Corporation, for the Fiscal Year 2023-2024, in an amount not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for the purposes set forth herein and in Table 1 and up to the amounts provided in Table 1, which hereby is incorporated by reference; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) in funding for these grants are available as part of the FY 2023-24 adopted budget in General Purpose Fund (1010), Business Development Organization (85411), Miscellaneous Contract Services Account (54919), Business Corridor Community Ambassador Project (1007109), Business Creation, Attraction, Retention, & Expansion Program (SC11); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to modify, extend or amend the grant agreements without increasing the amount of the grant awards.
