RESOLUTION ALLOCATING \$10,691,000 OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS BETWEEN THE CATEGORIES OF HOUSING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS AND ADMINISTRATION

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded \$10,691,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to the City of Oakland for the 2001-2002 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has established the Citizens Advisory Committee to recommend programs for funding to the City Manager; and

WHEREAS, citizens have provided information about the needs that should be addressed by these funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has prepared the annual needs assessment describing citizen identified community needs; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the allocation of funds for the fiscal year 2001-2002 shall be as follows:

Housing	38%	\$4,062,600
Economic Development	25%	\$2,672,800
Neighborhood Programs	22%	\$2,352,000
Administration	15%	\$1,603,600

and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Citizens Advisory Committee is directed to recommend programs that provide funding in proportion to the low to moderate income population throughout the CD Districts.







RE: REVISED DRAFT RESOLUTION

On January 30,2001, the Community and Economic Development Committee considered a report and resolution allocating \$10,691,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds between the categories of Housing, Economic Development, Neighborhood Improvements/Public Services, and Administration.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the Committee directed that clearer language be added about how the Citizen Advisory Committee would recommend programs that provide funding in a "fair way".

The attached revised resolution specifies under Further Resolved: "That the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) is directed to recommend programs that provide funding in proportion to the low- to moderate-income population throughout the Community Development (CD) Districts."
