2. Brief Description and History of the Municipal Improvement Capital Fund (fund 5500)

The City's Municipal Improvement Capital Fund (Fund 5500) was created in 1982 with proceeds from the sale of the Oakland Museum and Oakland Convention Center, with additional funds deposited from time to time. The amount on deposit reached a high of \$231 million in 1996. Besides new deposits, the only income for this fund has been, and continues to be, from investment interest earnings.

The funds are held by a trustee and may only be disbursed to finance the acquisition, construction, lease, or improvement of equipment, facilities, or other property held or controlled by the City. The City Council has appropriated MIC funds since its creation to fund various capital and improvement projects documented in the Capital Improvement Program Five-Year Plans. The FY 2003-05 Proposed Budget contains a \$19.5 million appropriation from this fund over the next two fiscal years, which will fully use up the uncommitted balance available in this fund.

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Re: Budget Questions: Capital Improvement Program & Funding

- 1. What is the historical reason for the establishment of the (a) Multipurpose Reserve Fund and (b) the Municipal Improvement Capital Fund and what are the revenue sources for these funds?
- 2. There is proposed a transfer of \$2.1 million per year from "discretionary" Multipurpose Reserve Fund. What is meant by "discretionary"? What is not discretionary within the fund?
- 3. During the 2001-03 budget, significant capital improvements came from the Equipment Fund, the Radio Fund, the State Gas Tax and State Park and Recreation Grants. However, the proposed budget anticipates zero to insignificant funding from these sources. What happened?
- 4. There is a large increase in reliance on the Multipurpose Reserve Fund, is this a proper expenditure of the fund both from a legal and a financial point of view?
- 5. The Municipal Improvement Capital Fund will be depleted by FY07-08, what is the effect of such depletion on our ability to meet debt service on our City Hall and Museum bonds?
- 6. It seems that we are depleting many of the capital funds, including the Equipment Fund, the Municipal Improvement Capital Fund and the Multipurpose Reserve Fund; yet we are faced with an 80-year repaving cycle for our street (industry standard is 25 years), dangerous backlog on sidewalk repairs and sewer maintenance, approximately \$40 million in storm drain system repairs and serious deferred maintenance on our parks. What is the administration's overall plan in funding the backlog of capital repair and maintenance costs?

Budget Questions: All Funds

- 1. In addition to the information requested by Councilmember Brunner pertaining to each filled position which is proposed for elimination, please additionally state whether the incumbent employee receives bi-lingual pay supplement.
- 2. What is the amount of funds budgeted annually for the Jack London Aquatic Center for 03-04 and 04-05?
- 3. What is the amount of funds budgeted annually for Fairyland for 03-04 and 04-05?
