Appropriation of Forty Thousand Four Hundred Nineteen Dollars (\$40,419) in Federal Funds from the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), for Overtime Costs of Four (4) Police Officers Assigned to the East Bay Task Force from October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004,

to the Oakland Police Department

SUMMARY

Adoption of the proposed resolution will authorize the acceptance and appropriation of \$40,419 in federal overtime reimbursement from the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), for the Police Department's participation in the East Bay Task Force for the period October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004.

FISCAL IMPACT

Officers assigned to the East Bay Task Force are budgeted in the Police Department baseline. The proposed resolution authorizes the appropriation of federal reimbursement to cover officer overtime costs incurred in relation to Task Force drug interdiction activities. The DEA will not reimburse the City for indirect costs related to the performance of overtime service; therefore, OPD requests a waiver of \$7,182.46 (17.77%) in Central Service Overhead costs. The maximum reimbursable for the period of October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004 will not exceed \$40,419 (\$10,104.75 / year x 4 officers). Said reimbursement funds shall be accepted in revenue account 46129 and appropriated to the FY 2003-04 budget to the U.S. Department of Justice Special Revenue Grant Fund (2112), Org. Code: 104631, Account No. 51214, in a project number to be assigned.

BACKGROUND

The DEA's East Bay Task Force (formerly the Alameda County Drug Enforcement Task Force) was formed to combat drug trafficking in the greater Oakland/East Bay area. The DEA established a permanent Oakland Resident Office (ORO) in 1998. Personnel from the DEA, United States Customs Service, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Oakland Police Department, and officers from other local law enforcement agencies staff the ORO. They conduct undercover operations, investigations, and gather intelligence data relating to trafficking in narcotics and dangerous drugs.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The DEA has agreed to reimburse the Police Department for overtime expenses of four (4) OPD Task Force officers, up to a maximum of \$10,104.75 per officer, for the period beginning October 1, 2003 and ending September 30, 2004. The maximum reimbursable amount for the period shall not exceed \$40,419.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic – Proactive drug interdiction will enhance the City's efforts to reduce crime, providing a climate that encourages economic development.

Environmental – No environmental opportunities are anticipated.

Social Equity – Targeted enforcement of drug traffickers in Oakland and the East Bay area can dramatically reduce/eliminate street-level narcotics activity, thereby improving the quality of life for local residential and commercial districts.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There are no ADA or senior citizen access issues contained in this report

RECOMMENDATION

Recommend approval of the report and adoption of the resolution.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE AND APPROPRIATION OF FORTY THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED NINETEEN DOLLARS (\$40,419) IN FEDERAL FUNDS FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION (DEA), FOR OVERTIME COSTS OF FOUR (4) POLICE OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO THE EAST BAY TASK FORCE FROM OCTOBER 1, 2003 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2004, TO THE OAKLAND POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (hereinafter "DEA") has formed an East Bay Task Force to combat drug trafficking in the greater Oakland / East Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, the Oakland Police Department has agreed to assign four officers to participate in the East Bay Task Force for the period October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the DEA agrees to reimburse the City for overtime costs of officers assigned to the Task Force up to a maximum of \$10,104.75 per officer for the period from October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the DEA will not reimburse the City for any indirect costs related to the performance of overtime service; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Manager or his designee is authorized to accept federal overtime reimbursement funds from the DEA in an amount not to exceed \$40,419 for the purpose of appropriating said funds to the Police Department for overtime costs of five police officers and administrative support assigned to the East Bay Task Force for the period from October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Central Service Overhead charges (17.77%) of approximately \$7,182.46 are hereby waived; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That said funds shall be accepted in revenue fund 46129 and appropriated to the U.S. Department of Justice Special Revenue Grant Fund: 2112, Org: 104631, Account: 51214, in a project number to be assigned.
