## Various Actions to Support Funding for Oakland's Capital Improvement Program & Bicycle Program

- OakDOT is recommending **five** resolutions to accept a total of **\$28,116,198** • in external funding and one resolution to support operations of the 19<sup>th</sup> Street Bike Station
- These six resolutions are grouped together due to their shared goals in supporting OakDOT's Capital Improvement Program and Bicycle Programs, as well as to streamline Council approvals



### 19<sup>th</sup> Street Bike Station Contract Renewal

- Oakland has provided operations and maintenance support to the 19<sup>th</sup> Street bike station, which provides valuable bicycle storage, repair services, and retail sales to the Uptown/Downtown neighborhoods since 2015
- Resolution authorizes the amendment and extension of an agreement with BART for the City for another five-years in the total amount of **\$371,640** from Measure BB Bicycle and Pedestrian Funds



# **Housing Incentive Pool (HIP)**

- Accept a **\$10,033,000** grant award from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) to construct the Laurel Access to Mills, Maxwell Park, and Seminary (LAMMPS) Phase II and Phase III project
  - Class 1, off-street shared use path on MacArthur Boulevard from Richards Road to Seminary Avenue, and on Seminary Avenue to Sunnymere Avenue. Provides connections to completed Phase 1 project between High Streets & Richards Road
- Commit ~\$11M in matching funds, which includes an \$8.6M Affordable Housing & Sustainable Communities (AHSC) grant and other local sources (Measure BB, Measure U)



# **Transit Oriented Communities (TOC)**

- Accept \$300,000 grant from MTC, no local match required
  Grant funding will support transportation demand management (TDM)
- Grant funding will support transportation de and parking policy updates, including:
  - Review and analysis of existing off-street parking requirements and Review of Oakland's existing TDM policies and requirements for development project conditions of approval;
  - Review of OakDOT's TDM plan monitoring process; and
     Community and stakeholder engagement to develop a City Council Ordinance
  - 3. Community and stakeholder engagement to develocity to implement any recommendations.



## **Alameda County Transportation Commission Comprehensive Investment Plan**

- Accept a total of \$6,000,000
- \$2,000,000 to construct the MLK Jr Way Complete Streets Project \$2,000,000 to design the Chinatown 9th Street Corridor Project • \$2,000,000 to support construction/procurement of Automated Speed Safety Cameras under the five-year pilot program Commit ~\$1,500,000 in match from local sources (Measure BB,
- Measure U)



### **Transportation Development Act**

- Authorize, accept and appropriate annual formula funding program for bicycle and pedestrian projects
- No local match required ullet
- **\$418,787** estimate for Fiscal Year 2025-26 proposed for: •
  - Comstock Way Stair/Path Rehabilitation
    - Stairpath reconstruction on Comstock Way between 17<sup>th</sup> Ave. and 14<sup>th</sup> Ave
  - CityRacks Bicycle Parking Program Phase 17
    - Supports citywide bike rack installation



# **Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA)**

- \$11,364,411 from the State's SB1 funds in Fiscal Year 2025-26 (gas tax) funds)
- No local match required
- Funds support street repair, curb ramp reconstruction, and bridge • repair, among other uses
- Required to submit a resolution every year with a list of projects proposed to be funded with RMRA in the following fiscal year
