RE: Informational Report On The Utilization of Funds Granted by Council Members to External Organizations

SUMMARY

This is the third informational follow-up report per the request of the Finance and Management Committee regarding the utilization of funds granted by Council Members to external organizations. The first report summarized the responses received from external organizations regarding the use of granted funds, and was submitted to the Finance and Management Committee on October 24, 2006. Due to the number of external organizations that did not provide a response, direction was given by the Committee to resend the request letter to those non-responsive external organizations and include: "Failure to respond may jeopardize future donations". The second report was submitted to the Finance and Management Committee on January 09, 2007, and direction was given to resend the letters, and phone each organization that had still not provide a response, and request that they do so.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is an informational report only; there are no fiscal impacts.

BACKGROUND

The Oakland City Council contributes Funds every year to support projects and services that will benefit the Oakland Community. To ensure accountability for all contributions, the Finance and Management Committee directed the Controller to identify, research, inquire, and document activities that were supported by granted funds to external organizations.

DISCUSSION

Determination of Funds Granted to External Organizations:

Detailed reports from July 01, 2004 through June 15, 2006 for all Council Member expenditures were analyzed.

These expenditures to external organizations were reviewed because the request for the disbursement of funds was not related to a contract, purchase order, or an invoice.

• Letters and Forms Sent to External Organizations That Received Granted Funds:

On August 28, 2006, twenty-two (22) external organizations were sent a letter with the "City of Oakland Contribution" form (Attachment C), requesting information by September 26, 2006 regarding their utilization of granted Funds

- Six (6) of the twenty-two (22) external organizations provided a response
