RE: Status Report On The Implementation Of Instant Run-Off Voting

Councilmembers:

This report provides an update on the status of the IRV system.

Update:

Currently, the Instant Runoff Voting (IRV) system developed by Sequoia Voting Systems is being tested for federal certification. It is anticipated that this portion of the testing will be completed by late March or early April, 2008. Once that step has been completed the system must then be approved by the Secretary of State. It is unknown how long the State process will take.

Voting Equipment:

Measure O passed in November, 2006 provides that the City shall use ranked choice voting once the Alameda County Registrar of Voters is able to conduct the election on behalf of the City in accordance with the requirements and procedures of the measure. The Registrar of Voters has indicated that without a certified system, his office would not be able to conduct the election on behalf of the city.

The possibility of counting the ballots by hand has been discussed as an alternative, since hand counting could be done without the certification of system software and firmware. The method adopted by the Town of Cary, North Carolina for hand counting was suggested, however, this method would still need to be approved by the Secretary of State for use in California. The Registrar of Voters has looked into the feasibility of using the "Cary Method" and has indicated that

he could not consider counting an IRV election if it compromised the other elections for which his office is responsible.

Action Requested by Council:

It is uncertain when the IRV system will be fully certified for use. Staff requests that the Council adopt (1) a Resolution declaring that the City is unable to use instant run-off voting for the 2008 elections and (2) an Ordinance conforming the Municipal Election with the State-wide primary election that will be held on June 3, 2008.
