RE: RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE CALIFORNIA DEMOCRACY ACT, AN INITIATIVE FOR THE NOVEMBER 2010 BALLOT, THAT WOULD REQUIRE ALL STATE LEGISLATIVE ACTION ON REVENUE AND BUDGET BE PASSED BY A MAJORITY VOTE

SUMMARY

This is an initiative proposed by U.C. Berkeley Professor George Lakoff for the November 2010: Ballot that, if passed, would amend the State Constitution to require all California state legislative actions on revenue and budget be passed by a simple majority vote (50 + 1). Currently, the California State Constitution requires that all budget and revenue legislation pass both the Assembly and the Senate with a 2/3 vote.

The lack of majority rule in the legislature has made it difficult for the legislature to raise the revenue needed to address serious financial conditions in the state. A recent consequence of the current 2/3 vote requirement is that a minority of legislators has prevented the passage of legislation that could help California meet critical needs in health care, education, physical infrastructure, and public safety.

The effect of the current 2/3 rule is that local governments, cities, counties, and school districts have had to reduce necessary services and functions with adverse consequences on Californians. By changing the 2/3 vote requirement to a simple majority vote requirement, the legislature's ability to pass budget and revenue legislation that could benefit Californians would be enhanced.
