RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt The Following Pieces Of Legislation:

- 2) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Grant Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program Of 2019 In Connection With The Ancora Place Project At 2227 International Boulevard, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$7,500,000;

- 7) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Grant Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program Of 2019 In Connection With The Mandela Station At West Oakland BART Project At 1451 7th Street, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$30,000,000;
- 8) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Grant Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program Of 2019 In Connection With The Fruitvale Transit Village Phase II-B Project At 35th Avenue And East 12th Street, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$7,500,000;

- 11) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program In Connection With The LakeHouse Commons Affordable Apartments Project At 121 East 12th Street, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$5,000,000.

REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL

Due to a staff oversight, an additional resolution, for LakeHouse Commons Affordable Apartments, authorizing the City to apply for, accept and appropriate Infill Infrastructure Grant (IIG) funds was not included with the agenda report and resolutions submitted to the City Administrator's Office on January 6, 2020.

The addition of LakeHouse Commons Affordable Apartments to the IIG projects changes the original agenda report in the following ways:

 Instead of ten resolutions, Council will now consider eleven resolutions in total as shown in Table 1 below.

Instead of seeking a total sum of up to \$79 million, the City will now seek up to \$84 million from the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development.

East Bay Asian Local Development Corporation (EBALDC) acquired the land for this project from the City through a competitive proposal process and Disposition and Development Agreement. The project will be situated in a prime location adjacent to Lake Merritt. The City has committed public funds to the project in the form of a loan for the value of the land, valued at \$3,382,500.

EBALDC has conducted extensive community outreach for the project, including the following:

- Several community meetings over a period from 2015 to 2017 regarding various iterations of the project.
- Outreach to the Vietnamese, Chinese, Latino and African-American Chambers of Commerce, as well as the Oakland Chamber of Commerce.
- Meetings with representatives from La Escuelita Education Center, Dewey Academy, and Oakland Unified School District.
- Collection of more than 500 signatures from Oakland residents in support of the project.
- Close coordination with the District 2 Council office.

Inclusion of this resolution is urgent because if it is not adopted by City Council prior to the February 18, 2020 application deadline, the City will be unable to submit a complete grant application, and the project will be deemed ineligible for funding.
