Bechtel Jr Foundation and the State Coastal Conservancy completed a three county initiative focused on developing and demonstrating new tools to help decision-makers better understand the economic value of natural systems in the three focus counties and the potential financial return on investment realized through accounting for the true costs and benefits related to conservation, land-use and resource allocation decisions. Because there were no relevant templates to build off of for creating this program, Jim developed the "portfolio approach" as the basis of the program. This approach examined each of the areas of potential impacts and developed a viable portfolio of potential restoration projects that would directly address the modeled, residual salmonid life history impacts. A cost was estimated for each project within the portfolio and these costs were summed to create a total cost for the implementing the 30-year program. In addition, Jim worked with City staff and financial experts to develop a 30-year cost allocation plan (in 2018 dollars) for implementing what is now called "The Non-Flow Conservation Fund". This fund will be an integral component of the City's HCP Finance and Implementation Plan and will provide funding for a wide array of instream and riparian projects to further improve conditions for listed salmonids.

**WHEREAS**, the Wildfire Prevention Commission consists of seven (7) members serving staggered terms ranging from one to three years, who are nominated by the Mayor and appointed by Council, and who must be residents of the city of Oakland, having resided in Oakland for thirty (30) days prior to appointment; now, therefore, be it
