Resolutions 1) Authorizing the Redevelopment Agency to Allocate One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) To The City for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project (No. B00630), 2) Authorizing The City Administrator, Or Her Designee, To Accept And Appropriate The One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollar (\$150,000.00) Contribution From The Redevelopment Agency For The Construction Of The Project and 3) To Award A Construction Contract to Beliveau Engineering Contractors, Inc. For The Same Project In The Amount Of Two Hundred Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$212,000.00), Including Contingency.

#### **SUMMARY**

Three resolutions have been prepared authorizing the Redevelopment Agency to allocate funds to the City for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project (No. B00630) and authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee, to accept and appropriate the funds from Redevelopment Agency and award a construction contract to Beliveau Engineering Contractors, Inc. the lowest, responsive and responsible bidder who has met the City's Compliance Program requirements. The project involves site grading, removal of lead-content soils, installation of a concrete retaining wall, addition of new asphalt area, planting area, installation of three new trees and related work.

The Madison Square Park Interim Renovation is consistent with the Mayoral and City Council Goal to "Build Community and Foster Livable Neighborhoods," by providing for clean and well-maintained facilities, amenities, parks and recreational facilities. The project is located in Council District 2.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The total project budget is \$285,000.00, and the amount allocated for construction of the project is \$212,000.00, including \$49,900.00 for contingency. The high contingency fund for construction is required as a reserve to address soil with elevated lead content discovered on-site. Project funds are available in Municipal Capital Improvement, Fund 5500; Madison Square Park Interim Project B00630; Capital Program Organization 92270; Landscape Improvement Account 57112 in the amount of \$31,000.00; Program IN06, Miscellaneous Grants, Fund 2999, Project G278720; Capital Program Organization 92270; Miscellaneous Contract Services Account 54919 in the amount of \$60,000.00. Additional funds in the amount of \$150,000.00 will be provided through the Central

District TAB Series Fund 9553, Central District Public Facilities Capital Project T314510; upon approval of the attached resolutions at which time a project number will be assigned.

It is anticipated that the improvements will increase the number of trash collections due to increased use of the park. However, site maintenance may be reduced as a result of improved surfaces. The net increase for maintenance is negligible and will remain within existing service level funding.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Project addresses the community's need for improvements to the existing under-utilized, substandard facilities at the Madison Square Park, located between 8<sup>th</sup> Street and Madison Street in Council District 2. Refer to *Attachment A* for a location map. Community groups have been using the nearby BART plaza site for over 20 years as a daily gathering place for various activities that improve the physical well-being principally of seniors and other adults. The activities include cultural dance lessons, tai-chi, martial art exercises, and other activities. Due to the planned demolition of the vacant BART Administration Building located at the Lake Merritt BART Plaza, there is an urgent need to provide usable space for the displaced community groups. The new asphalt and decomposed granite areas will accommodate hundreds of exercisers who are displaced by the closure of the BART Plaza.

In addition to making space for the exercisers, the addition of a basketball court, creation of hopscotch and four square grids on the newly-paved surface will provide the much-needed additional recreational amenities to local residents and youth, such as those currently limited to the over-crowded Lincoln Square Recreational Center.

A proposed master plan has been developed to fully renovate the park and is on the Park Prioritization Project List. While funds for the master plan need to be developed, the interim project is a short-term response to serve the community with improved facilities at Madison Square Park.

The Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project will increase the recreational area by installing additional asphalt and decomposed granite surfaces suitable for exercise activities, a basketball court for youth, hop scotch and four-square games for children, as well as planting strip and additional trees.

The interim project was issued to bid in July 2007. On August 6, 2007, the City Clerk received four bids for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project. Beliveau Engineering Contractors, Inc., Masto Construction, Bay Construction and Sposeto Engineering, Inc. submitted bids of \$162,100.00, \$170,428.00, \$204,300.00 and \$212,408.00 respectively. Refer to *Attachment B* for a summary of bids. The engineer's estimate is \$118,965.00 although available construction budget is \$212,000.00. The \$118,965 estimate includes soil off-hauling costs based on a limited quantity of standard soil disposal. The cost range for off-hauling soil may affect the construction cost due to the

Item: \_\_\_\_\_ Public Works Committee September 11, 2007 unknown quantity of soil with lead content on the site. The lowest responsive and responsible bid of \$162,100.00 was submitted by Beliveau Engineering Contractors, Inc. and is within the construction budget.

#### **KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS**

The Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project will benefit the Central Redevelopment Project Area by installing park improvements to alleviate the substandard park facility, and remove soil with lead as required by regulation. City Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funds are not available to provide financing for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project in the City's FY 2007-2009 budget. No other reasonable means of financing the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project are available to the City other than Redevelopment Agency funding. The use of tax increment funds from the Central Project Area for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project will assist in the elimination of lead-content soils and improve substandard park facilities in the Central Redevelopment Project Area by installing new recreational amenities including a youth basketball court, new landscaping, and new surfaces usable for physical activities. The use of tax increment funds from the Central Redevelopment Project Area for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project is consistent with the implementation plan adopted for the Central Redevelopment Project Area. Redevelopment Funds will provide the necessary funds to complete the project.

The City's Local / Small Local Business Enterprise (L/SLBE) programs have been met by Beliveau Engineers, Inc. There will be L/SLBE participation of 100%. The contractor is required to have 50% of the work hours performed by Oakland residents and 50% of all new hires are to be Oakland residents. The L/SLBE information has been verified by the Contract Compliance & Employment Services Division of the City Administrator's Office and is included as *Attachment C*.

Upon approval of the resolution, a contract will be awarded and construction is estimated to begin in November 2007. The project duration is 45 working days from the date of the Notice-to-Proceed and completion is anticipated no later than January 2008.

The construction contract specifies \$500.00 in liquidated damages per calendar day if the contract completion time of 45 working days is exceeded.

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#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project addresses community request for improvements to the substandard facilities at Madison Square Park. The project involves, grading, installation of a concrete retaining wall, new asphalt and decomposed grant areas, a youth basketball court, a planter strip, installation of three new trees, and related work.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

**Economic:** The project will generate jobs for Oakland residents, and business tax, sales tax and other revenues for the City by those who work on the project.

**Environmental:** The contractor will be required to use recyclable construction materials to the extent feasible and is required to recycle construction debris in accordance with City standards.

**Social Equity:** The improvements to the Madison Square Park will benefit the neighborhood and the community at large by providing added recreational amenities for users of all ages.

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

The improvement project will maintain accessibility to persons with disabilities and senior citizens. All construction will meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

#### RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

It is recommended that Redevelopment Agency allocate funds to the City for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project (No. B00630) and Council authorize the City Administrator, or her designee, to accept and appropriate the funds from Redevelopment Agency and award a construction contract to Beliveau Engineering Contractors, Inc., for the project in an amount not-to-exceed Two Hundred Twelve Thousand dollars (\$212,000.00). Beliveau Engineering Contractors, Inc. is a certified Small Local Business Enterprise, and they have met the SLBE requirements. Sufficient funds will be available to construct this project with the acceptance and appropriation of the Redevelopment funds.

#### 50% Local Employment Program/15% Oakland Apprenticeship Program

Beliveau Engineering, the lowest responsible bidder exceeded the 50% LEP goal but did not meet the 15% Oakland Apprenticeship goal on the Lincoln Square Junk Ship Renovation Project, its most recently completed City of Oakland project.

Per Program requirements, Beliveau Engineering has one year to work off the Apprenticeship shortfall hours by working Oakland residents on non-city projects. If at the end of this period, all the deficient hours have not been eliminated, the Contractor will forfeit to the City 150% of the wages for any remaining deficient hours.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRIBUTION OF \$150,000.00 IN AGENCY FUNDS TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND UNDER THE COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE MADISON SQUARE PARK INTERIM RENOVATION

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency wishes to fund construction costs to assist in the renovation of Madison Square Park, a substandard public park located adjacent to the Central District Redevelopment Project Area, including the removal of contaminated soils; and

WHEREAS, the Agency authorized an allocation of Agency funding in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00, including contingency, to the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project from the Central District TAB Series Fund (9533), Capital Improvement Projects – Economic Development Organization (94800), Central District Public Facilities Capital Project (T314510), Structures and Improvements Account (57311), and a new project will be created in the Central District TAB Fund (9533) and a mirror project will be set-up in the City Redevelopment Agency Project Fund (7780) in the approval of its Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Budget; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is consenting to the use of Agency funding for the Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project pursuant to Section 33445 of the California Health and Safety Code; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the Agency Administrator is authorized to contribute an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00, including contingency, under the Cooperation Agreement to the City of Oakland for the construction of Madison Square Park Interim Renovation Project (Project No.B00630); and be it


