INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBER TREVA REID AND PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE DAN KALB

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING STEPHEN AND AYESHA CURRY AND THE EAT. LEARN. PLAY. FOUNDATION FOR THEIR DEDICATION TO ENHANCING THE WELL-BEING OF OAKLAND YOUTH THROUGH THE REMODELING OF PLAYGROUND STRUCTURES AND PROVIDING ACCESS TO NUTRITION, LITERACY, AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY OPPORTUNITIES SINCE 2019.

WHEREAS, Stephen Curry, point guard for the Golden State Warriors and renowned for his NBA achievements, co-founded the Eat. Learn. Play. Foundation in 2019 with his wife, Ayesha Curry- an accomplished businesswoman, chef, restaurateur, and actress. The Foundation was established with the mission to eliminate childhood hunger, ensure children have equitable access to high-quality education, and provide them with safe, engaging spaces to play and recreate. Recognizing that nearly 14 million children lack access to adequate food and that 37% of Oakland youth live in food-insecure households- disproportionately impacting minority youth- the Currys have prioritized this critical work; and

WHEREAS, with the Eat. Learn. Play. Foundation's investment of \$72 million dollars, it has demonstrated unwavering commitment to the Oakland community. Focusing on the holistic development of children, the Foundation specifically emphasizes nutrition, literacy, and physical activity. These three pillars address vital needs to help shape the next generation of Oaklanders; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, the Foundation has delivered 25 million meals, ensuring that Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) students have consistent and equitable access to healthy food. With 77% of OUSD students qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, the Foundation also launched a multi-year initiative to open OUSD's new Central Kitchen, providing over 6 million scratch-cooked meals annually to 35,000 students across 85 schools; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation launched the Eat. Learn. Play. Bus, an innovative mobile program that delivers healthy meals and culturally affirming books to Oakland youth, ensuring

access to quality food and educational resources during weekends and school breaks. To date, the Bus has delivered over 25,000 meals, 100,000 books, and thousands of grocery staples to OUSD students, leading to improved student attendance and academic performance; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation's efforts extend beyond nutrition to promote literacy, allocating \$6 million dollars to initiatives such as the Eat. Learn. Play. Bus and Little Town Libraries program. These efforts aim to foster a love of reading, develop essential skills, and nurture curiosity and imagination among Oakland's youth. With 66% of OUSD third graders reading below grade level- including 85% of Black and Latinx students- the Foundation's goal of raising reading test scores is both timely and urgent; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation has committed to expanding its literacy programs with a goal of raising \$25 million dollars over the next five years to open 10,000 tutoring spots for students needing significant reading support. These efforts aim to empower OUSD students with access to educational opportunities that foster intellectual growth and close the achievement gap; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation has also prioritized play and physical activity, remodeling playgrounds in under-resourced neighborhoods to provide safe, high-quality recreational spaces. Recognizing that only 14% of Oakland youth meet the recommended daily exercise requirements, the Foundation views play as essential to children's physical and mental development; and

WHEREAS, in District 7, the Foundation has remodeled playgrounds at REACH Academy, 81st Avenue Campus, Lockwood STEAM Academy, and the Stonehurst Campus. Across Oakland, the Foundation has revitalized 17 school and community playgrounds (15 within OUSD), providing equitable access to quality play spaces for 6,600 students annually and working toward its goal of enabling 2 billion minutes of active play over children's lifetimes; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation plans to provide 25 public elementary school play yards by 2026, benefiting 11,250 students annually. These efforts, coupled with Stephen and Ayesha Curry's exemplary leadership, have fostered a sense of belonging for Oakland's youth, while supporting their physical and emotional well-being; and

WHEREAS, through their transformative leadership and Eat. Learn. Play. Foundation Stephen and Ayesha Curry have meaningfully impacted the systemic inequities faced by Oakland's youth. Their holistic and multifaceted approach has inspired countless others to give back, making them powerful advocates for the well-being of Oakland's children; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation's comprehensive work in supporting children's nutritional, educational, and physical needs has positively impacted thousands of Oakland families, creating lasting change and improving the quality of life for future generations;
