RESOLVED, therefore, That we the Oakland City Council, do hereby declare the twenty-first of October, 2006, in recognition of the Oakland Hills 1991 Firestorm and as part of National Fire Prevention Month; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the third Saturday of October is declared Wildfire Prevention Day, annually, in recognition of the Oakland Hills 1991 Firestorm and as part of National Fire Prevention Month.
