INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBERS REBECCA KAPLAN & ROWENA BROWN

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE LITTLE SAIGON COMMUNITY IN OAKLAND AS A CULTURAL AND ECONOMIC CENTER AND HONORING THE VIETNAMESE AND SOUTHEAST ASIAN PEOPLE'S JOURNEY AND HISTORY

WHEREAS, on April 30, 1975, a pivotal day in world history, North Vietnamese forces captured Saigon, the capital of the Republic of Vietnam (South Vietnam), effectively bringing the Vietnam War to a close; and

WHEREAS, the war had a devastating human cost, with approximately 500,000 Vietnamese civilians and 58,000 United States soldiers killed during the conflict; and

WHEREAS, after the fall of Saigon, millions of Vietnamese refugees fled their homeland to seek freedom in other countries, with approximately 800,000 resettling in the United States, where they have contributed significantly to the cultural, economic, academic, political, scientific, and artistic landscape of our nation, adding their contributions to the nation's multicultural fabric; and

WHEREAS, the Vietnamese community in Oakland plays a crucial role in fostering cross-cultural understanding and appreciation, contributing significantly to a wide array of fields, including politics, academia, business, science and technology, health care and the arts; and

WHEREAS, the stories of migration, survival, and success from Vietnamese Oaklanders serve as a testament to the values of freedom, hope, and the American Dream. The perseverance of the Vietnamese community in striving to flourish resonates throughout all of Oakland's unique and essential communities; and

WHEREAS, the 50th anniversary of April 30, 1975, serves as an important moment for reflection on the sacrifices made by the previous generation of Vietnamese Americans in the United States. These lessons of history will continue to guide future generations toward greater peace, freedom, and democracy; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: The City of Oakland honors and commemorates the 50th anniversary of the fall of Saigon, and honors those who lost their lives during the Vietnam War; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City of Oakland celebrates the Little Saigon Community as a cultural and economic center, and the Oakland Vietnamese community for their ongoing contributions to Oakland, and we reaffirm our commitment to promoting understanding, respect, and appreciation for the shared history and bright future of all who call this land home; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That we encourage all Oaklanders to join in the recognition of this cultural heritage celebration.
