

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE OFFICIAL INTENT OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND REGARDING CERTAIN CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FOR THE CITY OF OAKLAND'S SEWER SYSTEM TO BE REIMBURSED FROM THE

PROCEEDS OF A TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION

#### **SUMMARY**

The City of Oakland (the "City") has identified various capital projects relating to the City's sewer system, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto (collectively, the "Projects"). The City intends to finance the costs of the Projects of the sewer system, plus related costs of issuance, through tax-exempt obligations to be issued by August 2004. Federal tax law requires the City to declare its intention to reimburse various costs if it expects to first spend its funds on a project and later reimburse itself for those expenditures from the proceeds of any future tax-exempt obligations.

#### FISCAL IMPACTS

Approval of the resolution would allow the City's costs for various capital projects to be reimbursed by proceeds from a tax-exempt obligation to be issued in the future. Currently, the costs of these capital improvement projects are charged against the Sewer Service Fund (Fund 3100).

#### BACKGROUND

On September 30, 2003, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 12540 increasing the sewer service charge to fund the costs of improvements to the sewer system and to pay for the operation and maintenance of the sewer system.

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 requires that an official declaration must be made if the issuer intends to be reimbursed from tax-exempt bond proceeds, for expenditures incurred and paid prior to the issuance of tax-exempt bonds. A proposed resolution of declaration is attached to this report for adoption by the City Council.

Staff expects to return in June 2004 for City Council consideration of a resolution authorizing the sale and issuance of revenue bonds secured by the increased sewer service charge. At that time, staff will be providing a comprehensive update on the proposed projects, the anticipated schedule

for implementation, and information on the amount and timing of bond issues to finance the proposed projects.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The approval of the attached resolution will result in a positive economic impact on

the City by providing funds for additional capital improvement projects.

Environmental: There are no environmental opportunities associated with the transaction.

<u>Social Equity:</u> The various capital projects may be constructed in disadvantaged areas.

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There is no impact to disability or senior citizen access following actions under this report.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS AND RATIONALE

Staff recommends that the City approve the resolution declaring the official intent of the City of Oakland to reimburse certain capital expenditures for the City of Oakland's sewer system from the proceeds of a future tax-exempt obligation.

### ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

In order to proceed with this reimbursement of capital improvement costs, Council will need to approve the resolution to declare the City's official intent that certain capital expenditures of the sewer system will be reimbursed from proceeds of a tax-exempt obligation to be issued in the future.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE OFFICIAL INTENT OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND REGARDING CERTAIN CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FOR TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND'S SEWER SYSTEM TO BE REIMBURSED FROM THE PROCEEDS OF A TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland ("City") has identified various capital projects relating to the City's sewer system, as described in Exhibit A attached hereto (collectively, the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, all or a portion of the expenditures relating to the Projects (the "Expenditures") have been paid within the sixty (60) days prior to the passage of this Resolution or will be paid on or after the passage of this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to finance the costs of the Projects, plus related closing costs, with the issuance of tax-exempt obligations; and

WHEREAS, Federal tax law requires an issuer of tax-exempt obligations to declare its intention if the issuer expects to spend its funds on a project and later reimburse itself for those expenditures from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations; and

**WHEREAS**, the City reasonably expects to reimburse the Expenditures, plus related closing costs, by issuing tax-exempt obligations; and

WHEREAS, the maximum principal amount of tax-exempt obligations which the City will issue and use to reimburse itself for the Projects, plus related closing costs, is \$75,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970, the Guidelines as prescribed by the Secretary for Resources and the provisions of the Statement of Objectives, Criteria and Procedures for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act have been satisfied and that in accordance with the California Code of Regulations the actions authorized by this Resolution are categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA;

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. The City reasonably expects to reimburse the Expenditures with proceeds of one or more obligations to be issued by the City or another entity of the City or in which the



City is a member or which the members of the City Council act as the governing board or whose debt is subject to the approval of the City Council.

SECTION 2. The maximum principal amount of the obligations expected to be issued for the Projects is \$75,000,000.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is a declaration of official intent to reimburse expenditures pursuant to Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 4. This Resolution complies with the California Environmental Quality Act.

SECTION 5. All actions of the officers, agents and employees of the City or other entity of the City that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution, whether taken before or after the adoption of this Resolution, are hereby ratified and confirmed.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
