A RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE A REVISED FY 2004 URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE GRANT AMOUNT, ESTABLISH A NEW HOMELAND SECURITY FUND, WAIVE CENTRAL SERVICES OVERHEAD FEES, AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ADMINISTER THE FY 2004 UASI GRANT PROGRAM.

# **SUMMARY**

On January 20, 2004, the City Council approved Resolution 78295 C.M.S. authorizing the Interim City Manager to accept, appropriate and expend the Urban Area Security Grant funds, award contracts for the funds without further City Council authorization, and to return to City Council with the spending plan recommendations forwarded to the Executive Board by the Urban Area Working Group (UAWG). Copies of the January 20<sup>th</sup> report and resolution are attached.

This report provides the status of FY 2004 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) program and discusses the proposed spending plan along with a resolution to accept and appropriate the updated grant amount, establish a new Homeland Security fund, waive Central Service Overhead (CSO) fees for the UASI grant, and authorize the City Administrator to administer the programs included in the strategy and spending plan.

The grant amount has changed from the January report. The State had the option of holding back 20% of the grant to offset their costs for grant management. The State has since decided to pass 100% of the funding for FY 04 UASI grants down to the Urban Areas, increasing our grant award from the \$6.2 million estimate referenced in the January 20<sup>th</sup> resolution to \$7,808,348.

## FISCAL IMPACT

The attached resolution will authorize the appropriation of the \$7,808,348 in FY 2004 UASI grant funds to a newly established Homeland Security Unit (Organization Code 02951), US Department of Homeland Security Fund (Fund Number 2123), FY 04 Urban Area Security Initiative Project (Project Number G252910).

The grant allows 3.0% or \$234,251 to offset the management and administration expenses. This money will fund the Homeland Security Program Coordinator hired to organize, coordinate and

manage the grant and related activities, along with an estimated 0.25 FTE of an Accountant to prepare financial reports and assist with year-end reconciliation and audits. We are requesting the Central Services Overhead (CSO) to be waived for this program to ensure funding availability for grant administration expenses.

#### BACKGROUND

The City of Oakland is the core city of the Oakland/Alameda County/Contra Costa County Urban Area (OAC UA). The urban area has been awarded a FY 2004 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office for Domestic Preparedness. The key goal of the UASI grant is to assist the urban area with developing and implementing a regional plan for detecting, preventing, preparing for, responding to and recovering from terrorism events. The grant money will be passed through the State Office of Homeland Security.

# URBAN AREA HOMELAND SECURITY STRATEGY

In January, an Urban Area Working Group (UAWG) - comprised of representatives from various jurisdictions and quasi-governmental agencies within the urban area and representing a wide array of disciplines - completed an Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy. Using the guidelines provided by the State, the UAWG created goals and objectives to address Prevention, Mitigation, Preparedness, and Recovery from terrorist activity. In addition to planning for the OAC UA, the strategy had to align with the San Francisco Bay Regional Urban Area Strategy and with the State of California Homeland Security Strategy. (The SF Bay Regional UA is an umbrella oversight group with representatives from the three Bay Area core cities: Oakland, San Francisco, and San Jose.)

To provide expertise in the proper field, the UAWG divided into five disciplines; law enforcement, fire/EMS, emergency management, public works and general government. Each discipline created the goals and objectives related to their function and role in public safety and emergency management. Upon completion, the five lists were combined into one document. The draft strategy was reviewed and improved upon by the entire working group.

The completed Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy was submitted to the Urban Area Executive Board for approval prior to submission to the State Office of Homeland Security on January 31, 2004. The State Office of Homeland Security and the U.S. Office of Domestic Preparedness have since approved the Strategy.

#### STRATEGY GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The Strategy consists of goals and objectives to Prevent, Mitigate, Prepare for and Recover from acts of terrorism. The goals were prioritized on a rating scale from Critical - requiring funding with the FY 04 UASI Grant, to Low - important but only after the High and Medium Priorities have been addressed, or with other funding sources. The prioritization resulted in the selection of one critical priority objective and five high priority objectives to receive FY 2004 UASI grant funds.

Specifics of the objectives were presented to Council in a closed session on May 4, 2004. To prevent compromising the security of the plans, the grant objectives have been summarized. The objectives that have been allocated funding under the FY 2004 UASI grant include:

- 1. Enhancing existing and developing regional interoperable communication systems
- 2. Enhancing existing and developing regional information exchange networks
- 3. Reducing vulnerability of information systems
- 4. Reducing vulnerability of transportation systems
- 5. Expanding Incident Management
- 6. Improving Recall and Mutual Aid

(Note that all of the above objectives will result in a <u>regional</u> benefit, per requirements of the UASI grant).

# **SPENDING PLAN**

An Initial Strategy Implementation Plan (ISIP), or a spending plan, for the FY UASI grant was submitted to the State Office of Homeland Security on May 14, 2004. To develop the data needed for the ISIP, above six objectives were sent to four sub-groups of the UAWG to develop a spending plan.

The four groups, called Lead Teams, were organized around key stakeholders, working on the objectives that would benefit their discipline throughout the urban area. The team titles and their assigned objectives were:

Communications/Interoperability Team – Objective 1
Information/Dissemination Team – Objectives 2 and 3
Transportation Team – Objective 4
Overhead Team – Objective 5 and 6

The Teams have been collecting information since March 15 to include on a Spending Plan Template. The deliverable for each team was:

- Prepare a macro assessment of needs (non-scientific, based on the information available)
- Develop a detailed scope of work, include long-term commitments
- Develop a macro budget
- Develop a timeline for the scope of work
- Identify other potential funding sources
- Identify other efforts in this area (by other local agencies, State / Feds, etc.)

Spending Plan Templates were routed to the Homeland Security Program Coordinator. A combined report consolidating the four templates was created and routed to the Urban Area Working Group members.

On May 7, 2004 the UAWG reviewed and compared the implementation and spending plans developed by the Lead Teams for the Critical and High Priority Goals. A recommendation was made to the Urban Area Executive Board on how much funding to allocate to the identified objectives with the FY 2004 UASI grant. The Urban Area Executive Board voted on the recommendation later that day and the results were used to complete the ISIP that was submitted to the State on May 14, 2004.

A summary of the spending plan submitted to the State is as follows:

Acceptance, Appropriation and Spending, and to Award Contracts for the FY

Dear Chairperson Wan and Finance and Management Committee Members:

Attached for your consideration and approval is a resolution to grant the Interim City Manager the authority to accept, appropriate and expend funding, and to award contracts for the FY 2003-04 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant program.

# **PROGRAM BACKGROUND**

The Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) is a federally administered, Homeland Security grant program that provides funding to local governments and special districts to enhance their regional emergency preparedness and response.

An estimated \$6.2 million will be available to the Oakland/Alameda County Urban Area from the FY 2003-04 program. The UASI funds may be used for planning, training, and equipment purchases that would enhance regional interoperability, emergency preparedness and response. As with many other grant programs, the major requirement is that the UASI grant must supplement, not supplant, the grant recipient's existing funding streams. No match requirements exist for this grant.

The City will receive funding through the State, which will apply on behalf of all California Urban Areas to the Federal Department of Homeland Security. The State's application is due by the end of January, and all urban areas' allocations will be distributed within 60 days after the State receives the funds from federal government.



In order to be eligible for this funding, the Oakland/Alameda County Urban Area must take a number of required actions, as summarized below.

- Identify Points of Contact (POC). Both the City of Oakland and Alameda County have done so. The City's POC is Marianna Marysheva, Budget Director. The Point of Contact is the official liaison with the State Office of Homeland Security.
- 2. <u>Define the Urban Area</u>. Per the State Office of Homeland Security's requirements, the Oakland/Alameda County Urban Area includes Contra Costa County.
- 3. Establish an Urban Area Working Group (UAWG) and Executive Board. An essential requirement of the UASI program, the Oakland/Alameda County Urban Area Working Group (UAWG) will be an advisory body responsible for providing recommendations to the Executive Board (a sub-set of the UAWG) regarding the development and implementation of all UASI program elements for the Oakland/Alameda County Urban Area, including the strategy development and potential items to be funded by the UASI grant.

The Oakland/Alameda County UAWG will be comprised of representatives of the City of Oakland, Alameda County, Alameda County cities, Contra Costa County, and a number of special districts. Based on communications with the State Office of Homeland Security and Alameda County, a total of thirty-one members have been identified, including five representatives from the City of Oakland. A roster is attached.

The Executive Board, comprised of selected UAWG members, will be responsible for making funding allocation and spending decisions via a voting process. Our proposal to the State Includes a seven-member Executive Board, including four representatives from the City, two from Alameda County, and one from Contra Costa County.

- Conduct an Urban Area Assessment. The assessment has already been completed by the City's Fire Services Agency, in collaboration with the Oakland Police Department and Oakland's Public Works Agency.
- Develop an Urban Area Strategy. The UAWG will meet in early January of 2004 to develop the Strategy based on the Urban Area Assessment. The Strategy is due to the State by January 31, 2004.

#### **ACTIONS REQUESTED OF CITY COUNCIL**

I respectfully request City Council's approval of the attached resolution to grant the Interim City Manager authority to:

- Accept, appropriate and expend FY 2003-04 Urban Area Security Initiative funding allocated to Oakland.
- Award contracts to spend the funding allocated to Oakland under the FY 2003-04 UASI without further City Council authorization.

Based on the recommendations of the UAWG, the Executive Board will make funding allocation and spending decisions. Staff will return to the City Council with the UAWG recommendations forwarded to the Executive Board, on specific items to be funded with the FY 2003-04 UASI allocation to Oakland / Alameda County Urban Area, in order to seek the City Council's guidance regarding the spending plan.

- Accept, appropriate and expend FY 2003-04 Urban Area Security Initiative funding allocated to Oakland.
