AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE "STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION, 2009 EDITION" AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 12780 C.M.S. AND ALL RESOLUTIONS RELATED THERETO

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Standard Specifications, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the City Clerk, entitled "Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, 2009 Edition" (commonly known as the "GREENBOOK") are hereby approved and adopted as the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction in the City of Oakland. The Standard Specifications are adopted upon approval by the Council of the City of Oakland.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 12780 C.M.S. adopted on January 16, 2007 and all resolutions related thereto are hereby repealed.

Section 3. The Director of the Public Works Agency is hereby authorized to periodically review and amend the Standard Specifications to reflect advanced concepts and the changing technology of the construction agency.
