Participation in the Program

#### **SUMMARY**

The Oakland Police Department's Criminalistics Laboratory applied for and was awarded a grant in the amount of \$12,780 from the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for the Paul Coverdell National Forensic Science Improvement Act (NFSIA) Program. The funds will be used for staff training in direct relationship to the improvement of forensic laboratory services. The grant term for this initiative is March 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005.

### FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed resolution authorizes the City Administrator to accept funds in the amount of \$12,780 from the NFISA grant program, and appropriate said funds to the Police Department's Criminalistics Laboratory. Grant funds will be maintained in the State of California Grant Fund: 2159, Criminalistics Division Org.: 102610, Criminalistics Division Program: PS05, in a Project Account to be determined. #### **BACKGROUND**

In March 2005, the State of California, Office of Emergency Services issued a solicitation to crime laboratories under the 2004/2005 Paul Coverdell National Forensic Science Improvement Act. These competitive awards were available to state and local law enforcement agencies. The Police Department Criminalistics Laboratory submitted a proposal supporting four primary objectives:

- 1. To provide continuing education and training of forensic scientists
- 2. To maintain laboratory accreditation standards
- 3. To improve turnaround time for casework through Latent Prints Comparison, DNA Analysis, and Firearms Analysis
- 4. To restore services in Fire Debris Analysis

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The Governor's Office of Emergency Services, in collaboration with the California Association of Crime Laboratory Directors, provides training funds for qualifying forensic laboratories throughout California in order to maintain accreditation standards and to provide cost-effective services. The state determined that the best means to accomplish this is to provide education and training in technical and personal skills to California's forensic laboratories. It is anticipated that by increasing forensic staff training, each laboratory will become more effective and efficient in meeting the needs of the criminal justice system.

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### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Criminalistics Division consists of several units, each responsible for the scientific evaluation, analysis, and interpretation of physical evidence. The laboratory is structured into three major disciplines: Latent Print, Drug Analysis, and Major Criminalistics. In many cases, technical staff are assigned to more than one unit.
