YUI HAY LEE, Principal

Yui Hay Lee is the President and founder of Y. H. Lee Associates, an architectural and planning firm located in Oakland, California. Throughout the three decades of his professional career, he has been committed to excellence in design and to providing the highest caliber of architectural services with his enthusiastic personal touch. Mr. Lee was born in China and raised in Hong Kong. An international scholarship brought him to Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.
