1. Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare vou to contribute to the work of the Commission.

I have volunteered at various school sites, contributing as part of the PTA by organizing events, planning and supporting fundraising activities, and recruiting volunteers for the annual carnival at Chabot Elementary. My efforts also included categorizing books for the library, reviewing budgets, and allocating funds for positions and additional resources through the advisory committee. Additionally, I helped host, organize, and volunteer for the annual gala.

I have been a citizen of Oakland, Ca for over 45 years and have interacted with OPD on occasion. Filing a report for a stolen car, making a call for a disturbance. Speaking while out in the community.

For 24 years I worked in Alameda Probation Department and interfaced with OPD in a collaborative capacity. In my last assignments at Camp Sweeney and Director of Adult Field Services I interacted with officers often in reviewing clients on probation or approving joint operations with probation.

Yes, I have served on the board for the Oral Lee Brown College Scholarship nonprofit. During my tenure, I contributed to establishing the strategic direction of the organization, developing a new logo, fundraising, overseeing the financial health of the organization, and approving the budget. I was also involved in recruiting youth and hiring teachers and tutors for the organization.

My time on the board began shortly before the COVID-19 pandemic. Once the pandemic hit, it became challenging to maintain participation from other board members. The virtual meetings were difficult, and it was hard to sustain the momentum we had established before the pandemic, leading to significant turnover in board members.
