A Supplemental Informational Report On Compliance By Nonprofit Affordable

Housing Developers With The City's Employment Programs

SUMMARY

At the June 22nd presentation of a report on compliance with the City's 50% Local Employment Program (LEP) and the 15% Apprenticeship Program by developers of affordable housing, Committee members requested additional information specifically regarding:

- 1. What are the numbers of hours worked by Oakland residents on "off site" or non-City funded projects for which Housing Developers earned credit?
- 2. Is the Local Employment Program (LEP) goal 50% or something lower?
- 3. If a lower LEP goal is applied, what justification is needed? (And provide that information for the affordable housing developers covered in the original report.)
- 4. Is the Apprenticeship Workforce Development goal 15%, or is a lower rate sometimes applied?

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACT

Answers to questions 1-4 are provided as follows:

- 1. Approximately 65,651 hours or 6% of the total workforce hours were worked by Oakland residents on Off-site or non-City-funded projects.
- 2. The Local Employment goal is 50% total work force hours and 50% new hires. The program also allows contractors to earn up to half of the 50% goal on "off site/ non City-assisted jobs. In addition, contractors are able to deduct up to one-half for core employee hours in an effort to reduce the impact of layoffs of steadily employed core work force crews.
- 3. Exemptions/waivers, core employee hours and off site hours must be properly documented in order to award credit to contractors. To validate hours, contractors are required to (a) provide LEP staff with a list of all core employees (b) submit to LEP staff a valid DE-6 for each employee, and finally (c) LEP staff verifies that each core employee satisfies the definition noted above. Justification categories include for example current street address, valid photo identification, total hours worked, certified payroll reports, and the last four digits of the social security number. All hours are confirmed at project end. Sample check lists used to collect

- Performed by an Owner Operator.
- Performed in less than 40 hours.
- No more than two craft persons are required to perform the work of the subcontract, the Subcontractor hires no new employee to perform the work and the Subcontractor is a Small Business within the meaning of City policies.
- 4. The 15% Apprenticeship Workforce Development goal is 15% Oakland residents. As is the case with LEP, waivers may apply. As noted in *Attachment A*, 133,332 hours or 12% of the total workforce hours were achieved with Oakland resident apprentices.

With regard to Oakland resident availability, several trades have an intake process that occurs for limited periods of time (1 to 2 weeks every year or every other year), and include both written tests and oral interviews. Successful candidates are placed on an eligibility list that becomes the sole source for new apprentices to that craft. Examples of these trades include Electricians, Plumbers, Steamfitters, and Sprinklerfitters.

- Most apprentice programs are located outside the Oakland geographic region and it is difficult to access by Oakland residents.
- The City's 15% Apprenticeship program specifically states that a contractor is not required to fire existing apprentices in order to accommodate the 15% goal.
- A majority of contactors who work on City funded projects are unionized and have incorporated apprentices as part of their own core workforce. Those apprentices, regardless of their residency, are typically retained to perform work on City of Oakland projects.

In summary, the Local Employment Program applies an Oakland resident hiring goal of 50% of the total workforce hours and 50% of the new hires. The Apprenticeship Program applies a goal of 15% of total work force hours. Both programs allow contractors to achieve compliance either entirely on the City's project, or at least half of the resident work hours on non-City funded projects (off site). A very stringent justification process is followed in order to verify hours.

Of the 11 housing projects reported, the developers, BRIDGE Housing (Contractor-JH Fitzmaurice) and EBALDC (Contractor-Branagh) achieved the two highest percentages of Oakland Local Employment at a rate of 55% of the total project hours and 86% of the total project hours respectively. With regard to Apprenticeship hours, BRIDGE Housing (contractor-JH Fitzmaurice) achieved the highest level of apprentice hours at a rate of 18% of the total project hours. Resources for Community Development (Contractor-JH Fitzmaurice) achieved the second highest level of apprenticeship participation at a rate if 17% of the total project hours.

Overall, housing developers hired Oakland residents at a rate if 36% of the total project hours and 12% of the total project apprentice hours.
