Re: A Monthly Informational Report From the Chief of Police on Part I Crimes Which Includes Robberies, Burglaries, and Homicides, Committed In The City Within in The Last 30 Days, Specific Issues in Each Area (I, II, III,) and How The Issues Are Being Addressed

SUMMARY

As requested by the Rules and Legislation Committee on February 28, 2008, staff has prepared an informational report detailing crime and arrest statistics for all Part I crimes committed in the City of Oakland during the month of February 2008.

Staff analyzed statistical crime and arrest data for Part I crimes committed (Attachments A and B) and has provided a summary of area specific issues and plans to address them.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is an informational report. Fiscal impacts have not been included.

BACKGROUND

The Oakland Police Department is tasked with ensuring the safety of its citizens. An analysis of Part I crime trends enables staff to reassess current proactive solutions and establish new courses of action that will assist in the reduction of crime in the City.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The Department's Patrol Division operates in a geographic Area Command based structure. The City is divided into three major areas (Attachment C – Area Map):

- Area I which includes West and North Oakland and the Berkeley border (Beats 1 – 13);
- Area II which includes Central Oakland (Beats 14 – 25); and
- Area III which includes East Oakland and the San Leandro border (Beats 26 – 35).

Each Area was examined over a 30 day period to determine the types of crimes being committed, specific areas in which the crimes had occurred, and the best course of action to address the issues.

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Although each Area has its specific crime issues, the crimes of vehicle theft, robbery, and shooting frequently occur citywide and are a major concern for each Area.

Vehicle Thefts

While vehicle thefts are a constant source of criminal activities in Oakland, staff has not identified any discernable patterns in vehicle thefts or recoveries, nor have there been any significant similarities in suspects taken into custody.

Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology has proven to be a valuable tool in identifying stolen vehicles. ALPR is a device located in patrol vehicles that uses sensors to run checks on license plates. The system automatically scans moving and parked vehicles as officers drive throughout the City. If a plate comes back as stolen, the ALPR alerts the officer. The Department currently has four systems in use and will purchase an additional six units in very near future. Councilmembers Larry Reid and Jean Quan have committed Pay Go funds to purchase these new units.

Additionally, the Alameda County Regional Auto Theft Task Force (ACRATT) conducts surveillance operations to recover stolen vehicles. The task force recently arrested a serial car thief who was responsible for a large number of vehicle thefts throughout the City.

Robberies

Robberies occur on a daily basis; this includes armed¹ and strong-armed², street, and commercial robberies. Street robberies occur most often, and appear to be randomly committed by both adults and groups of roving juveniles (usually in groups of four to eight) who attack victims generally by force, and take small items (i.e., wallets, i-Pods, money). Victims of these crimes have been of all races and ages.

¹ Armed robbery is a robbery involving the use of a dangerous weapon such as a firearm.

² Strong armed robbery is a robbery not involving weapons.

Shootings

Shootings typically occur as a result of gang-related activity at and around known open-air drug locations.

The following information presents specific shooting and homicide details for each Area during the month of February:

Area I

There were three homicides and numerous shootings (reported and unreported) in Area I during this period. These incidents of violence can be attributed to the following factors:

- Gang related violence between gang members in the area of Apgar Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Way, and gang members in the area of 8th Street and Adeline Street;
- Gang related violence between gang members in the area of 8th Street, Henry Street and Chestnut Street and gang members in the area of 12th Street and Peralta Street;
- Violence between groups in the North Oakland area and the Berkeley area, near upper Shattuck Avenue.

Strategies

Officers engage in high visibility, proactive enforcement around BART stations in West Oakland, 40th Street, and in the Rockridge area near the 5600 block of College Ave. Three new Neighborhood Enhancement Team officers started on February 9, 2008; two are assigned to West Oakland and one to the San Pablo Avenue, Broadway and MacArthur Boulevard area. These officers are currently receiving training from Crime Reduction Teams and Problem Solving Officers in the areas of problem solving, surveillance, warrant search, and other crime prevention techniques.

Area II

There were three homicides and numerous shootings reported in Area II during this period. Some of these incidents of violence can be attributed to the following factors:

- Gang related violence in the area of 40th Avenue and Foothill Boulevard;
- Violence in the area surrounding 3000 block of MacArthur Boulevard and the area surrounding East 20th Street.

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Strategies

Staff is addressing the problem of Latino gangs by working with the *Fruitvale Public Safety Project*, a collaborative, multi-agency approach involving staff from various City agencies. (including Public Works, Parks & Recreation, and Code Enforcement) and the Measure Y Outreach Team. The program provides parenting classes on gang prevention, self-defense training, and a Measure Y gang prevention program organized by the Violence Prevention Network. In addition, it provides targeted location enforcement for police operations, which includes assistance from the Gang Unit. This program targets the four most significant gang locations in Area II which are: the 2200-2300 blocks of East 15th Street, 1500-1700 blocks of Bridge Avenue, 1900-2100 blocks of Harrington Avenue, and 38th Avenue, at Cesar Chavez Park.

Area III

There were six homicides and numerous shootings reported in Area III during this period. Some of these incidents of violence can be attributed to the following factors:

- A robbery gone bad in the area of San Leandro Boulevard;
- Violence during "sideshow" activity in the area surrounding Hillside Boulevard;
- Violence in the area above MacArthur near 64th Avenue.

Strategies

There are two new Spanish speaking Neighborhood Services Coordinators in Area III who will augment the Department's outreach to the Latino community.

In April, staff plans to participate in the 6th Annual School's Out Fair (sponsored by Councilmember Brooks) which will provide an opportunity to distribute crime prevention and educational information to citizens and youth. The School's Out Fair was launched in 2003 and brings together approximately 100 non-profit and government programs and resources in an effort to provide parents information on the variety of options available for their children's summer program activities.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Reducing the reality and perception of violent crimes in Oakland is a top priority for the Department. Staff will address drug, crime, and quality of life issues by saturating problem areas with patrol officers, Crime Reduction Teams (CRT), Problem Solving Officers (PSO), Foot Patrol Units, and other specialized units.

PSOs have been directed to show a greater presence and spend more time walking their beats. This is a proven deterrent to crime and a great opportunity for the officers, merchants, and

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residents to get better acquainted. In addition, Problem Solving Officers investigate and follow-up on leads related to residential burglary cases.

CRTs routinely conduct quality of life sweeps throughout the City, which focus on persons engaging in low level or minor crimes such as drinking in public, gambling, and loitering. These persons are contacted, identified, and cited or arrested. Patrol officers are also conducting these sweeps (as staffing and calls for service allow). The objectives are to send a strong message that minor criminal activity is not tolerated and identify persons engaged in criminal activity.

Truancy sweeps are also routinely conducted, as many of the juveniles committing crimes are truant. Officers pick up truants and take them to the Truancy Center where they are introduced to outreach workers. This exposes them to Measure Y programs (Leadership Excellence, Pathways to Change, and Youth Radio) and offers them positive, alternative lifestyles and life choices.

Area commanders meet regularly with the Department's criminal investigators to identify crime patterns and trends. Improved communications between investigators and officers makes information more accessible and leads to faster identification of suspects and their crime patterns/trends.

Traffic officers provide high visibility enforcement in targeted locations; the Mobile Command Post (MCP) is deployed and Patrol lineups and community meetings are conducted at these locations, which provides a heightened police presence in the community.

The City's Violence Prevention Coordinator and his team reach out to individuals in identified drug and violence hotspots by approaching individuals who loiter on street corners and locations of recent violent crimes and provide resource referrals to the available Measure Y services. This outreach has expanded from weekends to include weeknights.

Community Relations

Staff continues to build upon their relationships with the community by working collaboratively with the Neighborhood Services Coordinators (NSC) and the Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council (NCPC). Both are valuable resources in fighting crime and galvanizing community support.

Problem Solving Officers are expected to be the *expert* of their beat, and take the initiative to identify crime problems. They are also required to identify the areas of their beat where the highest volume of "calls for service" occur, develop a project in that area, or forward the information to the patrol officer to create a "patrol-based" project. Additionally, PSOs are expected to attend their respective NCPC meetings and assist the group in developing its "top 3" priorities, and return to the next NCPC meeting to propose a plan to address the three priority issues.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The Department's crime prevention efforts will assist in reducing crime in Oakland; improve our communities and the Department's relationship with the community. Lower crime rates encourage economic development.

Environmental: There are no environmental opportunities identified in this report.

Social Equity: The Department's response to crime leads to the identification, arrest, and prosecution of those responsible for committing crimes, making Oakland a safer place to live and work.


DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There are no ADA or senior citizen access issues identified in this report.


RECOMMENDATION / RATIONALE

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
