FACTS: OAKLAND SMALL SCHOOLS FOUNDATION

- Five schools served in 2005-06 38 schools today, all 45 by 2009
- 21 schools enrolled in OSSF premium services.
- \$250K raised in private funds for schools from 2003 to 2006 Over \$1 million raised in first guarter of 2007-08
- Over \$1 million generated in public funding for schools since 2005
- One staff person in 2005 six in 2007
- \$50K operational budget in 2003-04; \$380K in 2007-08

RESULTS: SMALL SCHOOLS

- Small Schools out-pace comparable traditional schools in academics
- OUSD is the most improved district in the state for the least three years – in part due to small schools
- Students feel safer at school and more motivated to finish school than in the old schools – by 200%
- Two OSSF small schools Think College Now and EnCompass Academy have the highest growth in academics in the district for the last two years



- Campaigning to raise over \$1 million to support programs and services for FY2007-2008.






THE SOLUTION FOR OAKLAND PUBLIC SCHOOLS NEW SMALL SCHOOLS

- Small Schools Policy adopted by district in 1998

- Maximum 400 students per school
- Focus on personalization, innovation, parent engagement, and high standards
- Prompted by dramatic disparity in services and parent resources between flatland and hills schools

SMALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS DEMOGRAPHICS


- Majority of students live at or below the poverty line

- Students live in neighborhoods where crime and violence are commonplace






