RESOLUTION NO. 91168 C.M.S.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH GRAYBAR ELECTRIC COMPANY, INC., FOR THE ACQUISITION OF ELECTRICAL, LIGHTING, DATA COMMUNICATIONS, SECURITY PRODUCTS, AND RELATED SUPPLIES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$1,500,000.00) FOR UP TO A FIVE-YEAR PERIOD EXPIRING NO LATER THAN JUNE 30, 2031 PURSUANT TO OAKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE 2.04.080

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland's (City) Department of Transportation (DOT) requires electrical, lighting, data communications, security products, and related supplies for its regular traffic signal and street lighting operations and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, OMC section 2.04.080 provides that "Where advantageous for the City, the City Administrator may purchase supplies or services as defined in section 2.04.010, through legal contracts of other governmental jurisdictions or public agencies that were awarded pursuant to an appropriate competitive process (i.e., advertised and bid for products and non-professional services; advertised and awarded through an RFP/Q process for professional services) without further contracting, solicitation, or formal bidding. Cooperative agreements are subject to City of Oakland purchasing and other applicable policies and requirements set forth in the City's standard contracts and insurance requirements"; and

WHEREAS, the use of cooperative agreements allows the City to ensure services are uninterrupted and provides the City with access to commodities and services at lower prices resulting in significant cost savings; and

WHEREAS, the use of another jurisdiction's outcomes resulting from a competitive advertising and bidding process in lieu of having to initiate one locally significantly shortens the contract procurement process for the City; and

WHEREAS, the existing legal contract between City of Kansas City, MO (Contract No. EV2370) and Graybar Electric Company, Inc., presents an opportunity for the City to piggyback to purchase supplies and equipment until January 31, 2029; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of electrical, lighting, and traffic signal equipment is essential to the City's DOT Safe Street Division's ability to maintain a 90-day stock inventory to replace or upgrade existing equipment and to expedite projects; and

WHEREAS, staff seeks City Council approval pursuant to OMC section 2.04.030 to award a contract, via the cooperative purchase agreement process, which exceeds \$250,000 in value, to Graybar Electric Company, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, funding is available to support the purchase in the Fiscal Year 2025-2027 Capital Improvement Program and Operating Budget in Measure BB – Local Streets and Roads Fund (2218) in the amounts as follows:

Traffic Signal Management Project 1005416 - \$1,046,000
DP350 Department Administration Project 1003469 - \$454,000; and

WHEREAS, funds will be identified prior to execution of each standard purchase order and shall be fulfilled by OakDOT's Safe Streets Division, through its operating and/or Capital Improvement Program budgets as needed, up to the capacity of the contract; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council authorizes the City Administrator to enter into a cooperative purchase agreement with Graybar Electric Company, Inc., to provide electrical, lighting, data communications, and security products, and related supplies, in the amount not to exceed one million five hundred thousand dollars and zero cents (\$1,500,000.00) up to a five-year period expiring no later than June 30, 2031 pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code section 2.04.80; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or his designee if authorized to complete all required negotiations, certifications, and documentation required to accept, modify, extend and/or amend this agreement; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Attorney shall review and approve the agreement as to form and legality and a copy of the agreement shall be filed with the Office of the City Clerk.
