RE: INFORMATIONAL REPORT TO THE CITY COUNCIL ON THE CITY AUDITOR'S WHISTLEBLOWER PROGRAM

Dear Members of the Council:

I am pleased to present the Fraud, Waste + Abuse Prevention Program (FW+A) of the Office of the City Auditor. One year ago, Councilmember De La Fuente, Councilmember Kernighan and I presented a request to the full City Council to fund a formal "Whistleblower Program." The backing of the elected leadership of the City sent a strong message to the public and the employees – that no matter what differences we may have, when it comes to creating a transparent, accountable government steeped in ethics – we are **standing up** for our city together, to combat fraud, waste and abuse.

Since September 2008, when the Council passed the resolution to fund the Whistleblower program, recently renamed the "Fraud, Waste + Abuse Prevention Program", many steps needed to occur to implement a solid program with policies, procedures and standards in place. The attached presentation outlines those steps. The Program was designed to conform to United States Government Accountability Office (GAO) Government Auditing Standards, Certified Fraud Examiners standards as well as general best practices. Specific highlights of the Program's essential components are:

• Confidentiality:

On January 1, 2009 the Whistleblower Protection Act (AB2001) sponsored by the City Auditor went into effect as state law. This law allows the identity of whistleblowers to remain confidential, therefore reducing the necessity to make anonymous claims.

• Protection from Retaliation:

Oakland Whistleblower Protection Ordinance (Oakland Municipal Code Chapter 2.38) enacted in September 2009 protects all city government employees who act as Whistleblowers from retaliation through the establishment of an administrative process that includes investigations by the City Auditor.

Confidential Reporting:

One of the nationally recognized leaders in the industry, EthicsPoint, was contracted in December 2008 to provide a secure hotline and website that allows individuals to make reports anonymously to a live operator or complete an online form 24 hours a day/7days a week. Reports are transmitted to the City Auditor via a secure network.

• Professional, Competent Staff:

In April 2009, Sharon Ball was selected as the FW+A Prevention Program Manager. Sharon has more than 35 years of auditing, investigation and program management experience in both the public and private sector. She was formerly an auditor for the U.S. Government Accountability Office and is currently in the process of becoming a Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE).

It is important to recognize the City's leadership for having the foresight to put in place a Program that provides a safe place for employees to voice their concerns of potential wrongdoing. The mere existence of a hotline serves to not only detect and disclose – but to deter acts of fraud, waste and abuse. And in our post-ENRON world, hotlines are becoming the norm, not the exception. In fact, the Sarbanes-Oxley (SOX) Act of 2002 forever changed the way that public companies approached fraud, waste and abuse. One SOX requirement is for all public companies to implement a formal reporting mechanism, such as a hotline, to receive reports of fraudulent and inappropriate activity. The City now stands in good company – with thousands or organizations world-wide working to implement effective systems of anti-fraud controls.


In closing, the Office of the City Auditor is mounting a public outreach campaign as our next step in preventing fraud, waste and abuse. In the next several weeks, posters will be distributed and a public service announcement will run on KTOP. The outreach campaign is a critical component to ensure employees and the public know how to safely report incidents of fraud, waste and abuse. I encourage each Councilmember to reach out to your constituents in your newsletters, websites and public forums to inform them of the Fraud, Waste + Abuse Prevention Program. Together with the Fraud, Waste + Abuse Prevention Program, we are standing up to protect our City, empower our employees and reassure our citizens.


FW+A Prevention Program State Law & Local Ordinance

- Municipal Whistleblower Protection Act
 - Protects the identity of employees and citizens who report violations
 - Mandates the confidentiality of the process the reporter, the investigation and the results
- Oakland Whistleblower Ordinance
 - Prohibits retaliation against employees who act in good faith as whistleblowers
 - Provides an administrative complaint process for employees


FW+A Prevention Program Objectives

- Identify and stop losses of city resources and act as a deterrent to fraud, waste and abuse
- Provide a safe method for employees and the public to report suspected fraud, waste and abuse
- Protect employees from retaliation
- Ensure transparency, accountability and integrity in Oakland's government

FW+A Prevention Program Annual Approved Funding





FY 2008-2009 Used as of 6/30/09 FY 2009-10 Carry Forward \$250,000 \$39,500 \$210,500

ACFE 2008 Report to the Nation found tips are the most effective means of detecting fraud. In the Government sector **50%** of the known frauds were detected initially through tips.





The ACFE Report also documented **58%** of tips originate from employees






- The City Auditor has contracted with EthicsPoint, an independent vendor, to provide a secure server and trained intake specialists











- EthicsPoint assigns a unique code called a "report key" to the reporter
- Reporter uses the report key and password to check their report for feedback or questions from the City Auditor
- Reporters are reminded discussion of their complaint with others may jeopardize their confidentiality and affect the investigation
- To preserve the confidentiality of the process, updates on investigations are not provided
