

DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FIRE VICTIMS

WHEREAS, The Oakland 1991 Firestorm was up to that point the largest urban fire in the history of the United States, burning 3471 dwellings, killing 25 people, injuring 150 more, and costing \$2.2 billion; and

WHEREAS, many organizations and cities across the state and thousands across the nation and world sent relief to Oakland to fight the fire and rebuild the area; and

WHEREAS, because of this, we in Oakland are in a unique situation to understand the years of difficulty facing the Southern California communities in rebuilding their neighborhoods; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: that Saturday, November 8, 2003 be commemorated as a Day of Remembrance and Support for fire victims in California, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: that we urge all Oaklanders to join in support efforts and aid to the rebuilding efforts in Southern California.


