#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator To Enter Into A Memorandum Of Agreement With The Federal Aviation Administration For City Of Oakland Personnel To Provide Emergency Response Services At The Oakland Airport For Risks Associated With Natural, Human Related, And Or Technological Hazards

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) sets forth the agreement between the City of Oakland and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) authorizing the Oakland Fire Department to provide emergency response service to the Air Traffic Control Tower at the Oakland International Airport.

## **BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**

In 1997, City Council via Resolution No. 73115 C.M.S., authorized the City of Oakland (City) to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Port of Oakland (Port) to provide fire protection and aircraft crash rescue services at the Oakland International Airport (Airport).

The City subsequently entered into several agreements to supplement the MOU to continue to provide ARFF services, the latest of which (the fifth supplement) expires December 31, 2024.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is requiring a Memorandum of Agreement to be incorporated into the Air Traffic Control Tower Occupant Emergency Plan affirming that the City of Oakland provide emergency response service to assist personnel in dealing with the risks associated with natural, human related, and or technological hazards.

The adoption of this resolution advances the citywide priority of ensuring **holistic community safety**, which includes ensuring the safety of millions of visitors which utilize the Oakland International Airport each year.
