Whee my know edge s not specific to East Oak and or community organizing efforts there, I can provide genera information, tips, and strategies on how to engage in community organizing and advocate for improved bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. My studies as an undergrad at UC Berke ey to pursue Landscape Arch tecture as a career have g ven me some insight into designing public spaces that are safe, access be, and attractive for pedestrians and boyc sts. WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 18815 C.M.S., adopted February 4, 2014, created the Oakland Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission to advise City Council and staff on bicyclist- and pedestrian- specific policies, projects, and programs, and on the accommodation of bicyclists and pedestrians in all transportation plans, policies, projects and programs, and to provide annual reports to the Public Works Committee of the City Council, to summarize the Commission's work over the course of the year, and to identify key policy issues affecting the safety of and access for bicyclists and pedestrians in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission consists of nine members serving three-year staggered terms with no more than six consecutive years of service by any Commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Sheng Thao reappoints David Ralston and appoints Enjoleah Daye and Cynthia Herrera to each serve on the Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission subject to confirmation by the City Council; now therefore be it
