RESOLUTION

1. AWARDING AND/OR AMENDING GRANT AGREEMENTS AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS TO THE HOMELESS SERVICE PROVIDERS AND FOR THE TERMS IDENTIFIED IN TABLES 1, 2, AND 3 USING UP TO \$20,397,380 OF STATE HOMELESS, HOUSING, ASSISTANCE, AND PREVENTION (HHAP) FUNDS, \$1,086,139 IN FEDERAL FUNDS, AND \$2,300,000 IN LOCAL MEASURE AND GPF FUNDS;
2. WAIVING THE LOCAL/SMALL LOCAL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (L/SLBE) REQUIREMENT FOR PROVIDERS IDENTIFIED IN TABLES 1 AND 2 FOR THE PROVISION OF HYGIENE SERVICES AT HOMELESS ENCAMPMENTS AND HOMELESS SYSTEM SUPPORT;
3. AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO RENEW CONTRACTS FOR ONE ADDITIONAL 12-MONTH TERM DEPENDENT ON REVIEW OF QUANTITATIVE AND QUALITATIVE DATA; AND
4. MAKING CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) FINDINGS

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2023, the City Council passed Resolution No. 89777 C.M.S., which, among other things, appropriated up to \$26,044,615 of Homeless, Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) Round 4 funds (HHAP-4) and awarded grant agreements and professional services agreements to homeless service providers for a term through June 30, 2024 using Homeless, Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) funds, general purpose funds and Measure Q funds; and

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2023, the City Council passed Ordinance No. 13759 C.M.S. (Shelter Crisis Ordinance), which appropriated up to \$65,000,000 of HHAP funding through fiscal year (FY) 2025/26; and

WHEREAS, the State of California has notified the City of their HHAP Round 5 (HHAP-5) allocation in the amount of \$28,446,565.83 and is awaiting approval of application and final contract execution by the State; and

WHEREAS, HHAP funds are integral to the City of Oakland's homeless intervention system to maintain existing emergency homeless interventions; and

WHEREAS, to continue homeless programming at the current service level including the provision of hygiene services, waivers to the local/small local business enterprise (L/SLBE) requirement are needed for operators providing critical health services including shower and porta potty hygiene services; and

WHEREAS, staff now seeks authorization to enter into agreements for homeless services with service providers as indicated in Table 1 below; and

WHEREAS, in order to increase the service quality and safety of the City's shelter interventions, staff also seeks authorization to increase the amounts of certain contracts as specified in Table 1 up to \$250,000 per contract, should additional funding from private sources, additional HHAP funds, competitive grants, or other sources, subject to Council appropriation if applicable and funding requirements; and

WHEREAS, the State of California, Interagency Council on Homelessness (Cal ICH) is strongly encouraging the use of HHAP and other funds for capacity building and professional development for service providers, including removing barriers to contracting with culturally specific service providers and building capacity of providers to administer culturally specific services; and

WHEREAS, the City Administrator has determined that the agreements are professional, scientific or technical and temporary in nature, and the performance of the agreements shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive service; and

WHEREAS, staff may need to shift HHAP funds between the agreements in Tables 1 and 2 or between fiscal years to ensure that all funds are timely expended and align with regulatory requirements; and

WHEREAS, the City has an existing lease agreement with Game Changer (Marine), LLC for the Wood Street Community Cabin Program and Wood Street Safe RV Program located at 2201 and 2601 Wood Street, for an annual rent of \$80,000 through December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, funding for the HHAP programs in Table 1 and 2 are appropriated in the State of California Fund (2159), Community Housing Services Org (78411), HHAP FY2021 thru FY2023 Project (1005248), HHAP Round 2 Project (1006126), HHAP Round 3 Project (1006326), HHAP Round 4 Project (1006961), HHAP Round 5 Project (1007402), Homeless Services & Support Program (NB41); and

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council awards the following grants, professional services agreements, lease payments, and/or rental contracts for homeless intervention services in an amount not to exceed the specified amount for terms identified in Tables 1 and 2 below using the “actual amount” of HHAP funds identified below, or the “up to amount” should additional funds become available during the term, subject to any applicable funding regulations and requirements:

FURTHER RESOLVED: That based on information provided by the City Administrator, the City Council finds that these professional services agreements are of a professional and temporary nature and shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive civil service; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the use of City-owned or City-leased land for less than fair market rental value by the above-listed providers for homeless programs is in the best interest of the City; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council finds and determines, after independent review and consideration, that this action complies with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because these agreements are categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Sections 15301 (existing facilities); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to make such amendments to the approved grants and/or professional services agreements as may be necessary to achieve the purposes of this Resolution or to ensure timely spend down of time-limited funds, including moving HHAP funds between the agreements in Tables 1, 2, and 3 or between fiscal years, subject to any applicable funding regulations and requirements; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to amend and renew contracts listed in Tables 1, 2 and 3 for up to twelve additional months without returning to City Council, contingent on review of qualitative and quantitative programmatic data; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That prior to execution, all agreements and amendments shall be reviewed and approved as to form and legality by the City Attorney and executed copies shall be filed with the City Clerk.
