

RESOLUTION NO. 89174 C.M.S.

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**A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 88714 C.M.S. TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF FUNDING ACCEPTED AND APPROPRIATED FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF AGING (CDA) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$109,765 FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$1,866,599 FOR THE MULTIPURPOSE SENIOR SERVICES PROGRAM (MSSP) FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2021-2022**

**WHEREAS**, on June 15, 2021, City Council adopted Resolution No. 88714 C.M.S., which accepted and appropriated a grant in the amount of \$1,756,834 from the California Department of Aging (CDA) for the continued implementation of the Multipurpose Senior Services Program (MSSP) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-2022; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2021, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved an amendment of MSSP submitted by the CDA and the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), which added participant slots and corresponding funding effective January 1, 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, it is anticipated that the City of Oakland will now receive additional funds of \$109,765, totaling \$1,866,599, from the CDA for FY 2021-2022 for MSSP; and

**WHEREAS**, the ongoing agreement with the CDA will be funded by Title XIX Social Security Act Funds and the State of California General Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, MSSP provides case management and in-home support services to MediCal eligible, low income seniors who are frail and at-risk of nursing home placement to age in their homes and communities rather than in institutional settings; and

**WHEREAS**, aging in place in the community contributes to reduced social and family isolation and less health risks than congregate as seen during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, the additional funding will allow MSSP to support an additional 41 clients per month for a total of 369; and

**WHEREAS**, MSSP is a long-standing City program, with the City Council having approved the application for the original MSSP Standard Agreement funds via Resolution No. 57740 C.M.S., dated December 12, 1978; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council hereby amends Resolution No. 88714 C.M.S. to increase the amount of MSSP funding accepted and appropriated from the CDA in the amount of \$109,765, for a total amount of \$1,866,599, for FY 2021-2022; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That said funds are to be included in the Department of Health and Human Services Fund (2128) Multipurpose Senior Services Program Organization (75231), and Administration/Case Management Support Project/Award (1005549/23370), Case Management Project/Award (1005550/23370), and Waived Services Project/Award (1005551/23370); and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the City Council hereby authorizes the City Administrator or a designated representative to conduct all negotiations, and execute and submit all documents, which may be necessary for the receipt and completion of the aforementioned increased MSSP funding, including amendment of the Standard Agreement (MS-2021-01) with CDA.
