The Committee approved the ordinance as amended to read as follows:

1. Section 3. Membership & Quorum. (a) The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members, at least six (6) of whom are Oakland residents. Pursuant to Section 601 of the Charter, members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the Council. Each Councilperson shall nominate for the Mayor's consideration his/her own recommendation for Commission member. Notwithstanding such recommendation, the Mayor retains full appointment authority pursuant to the Charter.

2. Section 3. Membership & Quorum. (g) All members of the Privacy Commission shall be persons who have an interest in privacy rights as demonstrated by work experience, civic participation, and/or political advocacy. No member may be an elected official. Members of the Privacy Commission may represent the following criteria to the extent possible: (1) an attorney, legal scholar, or activist with expertise in privacy, civil rights, or a representative of an organization with expertise in the same; (5) a member of an organization which focuses on government transparency and openness or an individual, such as a former government employee, with experience working on government transparency and openness.

Section 1. Chapter. (C) Definitions. "Locked Container" means a secure container that is fully enclosed and locked by a padlock, key lock, combination lock, or similar locking device as defined by California Penal Code Section 16850. It includes a lock box that is listed on the California Department of Justice Bureau of Firearms roster of approved firearm safety devices. For purposes of this Chapter, it does not include a bag or other container made of fabric or other penetrable material, such as a regular purse, backpack, or gym bag."
