

**INTRODUCED BY MAYOR BARBARA LEE
COUNCILMEMBER UNGER, COUNCILMEMBER GALLO, AND
COUNCILMEMBER HOUSTON**

**RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S REAPPOINTMENTS OF
INGRID SEVERSON, CYNTHIA ELLIOTT AND JACQUELINE LONG AS
MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY POLICING ADVISORY BOARD**

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 72727 C.M.S., adopted June 11, 1996, and amended by Resolution No. 73916 C.M.S., adopted November 4, 1997 (which changed the Community Policing Advisory Board's status from a Task Force to a Board), established that the Community Policing Advisory Board shall oversee, monitor and report at least twice yearly and provide recommendations on community policing to the Mayor, City Council, City Manager, and director of Police Services; and

WHEREAS, the Community Policing Advisory Board consists of fifteen (15) members, all Oakland residents, serving three-year terms, three appointed by the Mayor, one by each Councilmember, one by the Oakland Housing Authority, one by the Oakland Unified School District Board, and two by the Home Alert Steering Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Barbara Lee has reappointed Ingrid Stevenson, Cynthia Elliott, and Jacqueline Long to serve three-year terms, subject to confirmation by the City Council; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby confirms the appointment of:

Ingrid Severson, to serve a three-year term as the District 1 representative on the Community Policing Advisory Board beginning March 25, 2026, and ending March 24, 2029, filling the vacant seat previously held by herself.

Cynthia Elliott, to serve a three-year term as the District 5 representative on the Community Policing Advisory Board beginning March 25, 2025, and ending March 24, 2028, filling the vacant seat previously held by herself.

Jacqueline Long, to serve a three-year term as the District 7 representative on the Community Policing Advisory Board beginning March 25, 2026, and ending March 24, 2029, filling the vacant seat previously held by herself.


