### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator To Renew The Oakland Fund For Children And Youth Grant Agreements Between The City Of Oakland And Various Public And Non-Profit Agencies To Provide Direct Services For Children And Youth In FY 2018-2019 In An Amount Not To Exceed \$15.210.316: Which Includes The Award Of One Grant To Covenant House California In An Amount Not To Exceed \$51,500.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

City Council adoption of the proposed resolution will authorize the City Administrator to renew grant agreements with agencies providing direct services for children and youth through the Kids First! Children's Fund in the amount of \$15,210,316 for FY 2018-2019. The Oakland Fund for Children and Youth (OFCY) Planning and Oversight Committee recommends renewal of 147 program grants to implement the third and final year of the OFCY 2016-2019 Strategic Investment Plan. The recommendation includes continued OFCY funding of \$51,500 for the DreamCatcher Youth Services program. The resolution reflects the change in management of the program and OFCY grant from Alameda Family Services to Covenant House California.

**Attachment A** provides a complete list of agencies and grant amounts for the 147 programs. The programs recommended for renewal funding are nearing completion of the second year of the three-year grant cycle. Through the first half of the fiscal year, programs recommended for renewal have served nearly 24,000 children and youth and over 1,600 parents and caregivers, and provided nearly 2.5 million hours of service.

#### **BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**

Oakland voters passed Measure D in July 2009, to revise the Kids First! Children's Fund Amendment in the Oakland City Charter (originally passed as Measure K in November 1996), and continue to set aside general purpose funds to address the well-being of Oakland children and youth from birth through age 21. OFCY is overseen by a 17-member public commission composed of one youth and one adult appointee per Councilmember, and one appointee by the Mayor. The Planning and Oversight Committee (POC) is responsible for the completion of a three-year Strategic Investment Plan, the solicitation of proposals for funding to implement the Plan through an open and fair application process, and the selection of the recommended grant awards for Council's approval.

Approval of the OFCY Strategic Investment Plan (2016-2019) by the City Council on October 20, 2015 (Resolution No. 85844 C.M.S.) was followed by the release of the OFCY Request for Proposals (RFP) in November 2015. The resulting package of grant awards recommended by the POC for the three-year grant cycle (2016-2019) was approved by City Council in June 2016 (Resolution No. 86226 C.M.S.) and renewed for a second year of funding in June 2017 (Resolution No. 86792 C.M.S.). The POC unanimously approved renewal of 148 program grants for a third and final year of funding in FY 2018-2019 at its April 2018 meeting. One program, Northern California Society to Prevent Blindness, an Affiliate of the National Society to Prevent Blindness, has informed OFCY in late April 2018 that their Board of Directors has declined the grant in the amount of \$30,697 for the third year of funding, bringing the total number of grants to be funded down to 147 for FY 2018-2019. The POC and OFCY staff are currently developing the Strategic Investment Plan for FY 2019-2022 for Council approval. The new Strategic Investment Plan will be the basis for the development and release of the next OFCY Request for Proposals (RFP) in late 2018 and the selection of programs for funding for FY 2019-2020.

### **ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES**

#### **OFCY Goals and Strategic Priorities**


The strategic priorities address the four goals outlined in Measure D: 1) Support the healthy development of young children, 2) Help children and youth succeed in school and graduate high school, 3) Prevent violence and reduce youth involvement in crime and gangs, and 4) Help youth transition to productive adulthood. **Table 1** on the following page reflects the amounts and the number of programs funded for the OFCY funding strategies recommended in this report.

**Chart 1** below provides a representation of the percentage of funding by strategy.



OFCY funding for 147 programs in FY 2018-2019 exceeds \$15.2 million. Programs are evaluated by OFCY's independent evaluators, Social Policy Research Associates (SPR) and Public Profit, for performance, quality, and outcomes. The evaluation reports for FY 2016-2017 (year one of funding) were adopted by Oakland City Council on April 17, 2018, and reports for year two outcomes will be available in the late 2018. At mid-point during the current, second year of funding, more programs are on track to meet year-end performance benchmarks (82)

percent) than at mid-point in year one (68%), indicating an overall improvement in grant management, program planning, and program performance.

#### **Summary of Grant Renewal Review**

Programs are reviewed prior to the recommendation for renewal of funding in years two and three based on the benchmarks established by the POC, data in the mid-year evaluation reports, and updated third quarter data to validate progress in meeting performance targets. The mid-year performance benchmark is defined as programs that achieve 80 percent of their projected hours of service, and reach at least 40 percent of their annual enrollment target. Programs below these benchmarks are reviewed extensively for scope of work changes prior to recommendations for renewal. Overall, 120 out of 147 programs (82 percent) were above both performance benchmarks at mid-year review.

Most of the programs that fell below performance standards (20 out of the 27) were first-time OFCY grant recipients in the 2016-2019 three-year funding cycle, and are still adjusting to provide stable and consistent programming and provide accurate projections of performance. Nearly half of the programs attribute shortfalls to a difficulty in hiring or retaining adequate staffing, which impacts program delivery.

OFCY staff worked directly with the agencies in the second half of the grant year to develop plans to address the reasons behind the shortfalls as well as plans for strengthened programming in 2018-2019. Staff worked with programs to correct and adjust projected participation and hours of service to be more accurate, monitored the performance of these programs during the third quarter of the year, conducted site visits and consulted with programs in the development of plans for improvement. Eight programs flagged at mid-year are now on track for satisfactory performance and eleven programs are nearing performance benchmarks after three quarters. The remaining eight programs are short of benchmarks but have made adjustments to address shortfalls and are continuing to provide valued services to at-risk populations. More information on programs' progress through the third quarter is included in **Attachment A**.

The POC's recommendations and the resolution also incorporate changes for FY 2018-2019 to reflect a change in the agency managing the DreamCatcher Youth Services program. The program provides support for homeless and at risk youth ages 13-18. In 2017-2018, the program was transferred from Alameda Family Services to Covenant House California for operation. OFCY currently provides a grant of \$50,000 for the DreamCatcher Youth Services program for FY 2017-2018, and a transfer of the grant award will support continued OFCY funding of \$51,500 for the program in FY 2018-2019.

An adjustment to grant amounts to provide a three percent increase for rising cost-of-living expenses in the third and final year of the three-year grant cycle increases the total grant amount funded from \$14,797,101 to \$15,210,316. This will provide an additional \$443,018 in funding across the 147 programs to support increased staffing costs and other programmatic expenses.

A summary of the funding strategies and progress to date during this first year are presented below. Maps of current program locations by funding strategy are included as **Attachment B**.

### Early Childhood Funding Strategies

**Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation** programs provide classroom consultations and/or individual or child-centered mental health consultation services at Head Start, Early Head Start, and Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) Childhood Development Centers. Through mid-year in 2017-2018, programs have reached 2,323 children and have provided over 4,100 hours of mental health consultation services at 48 different early childhood education sites.

Parent Support and Engagement programs support parent leadership and peer connection opportunities for parents of young children from birth to five to learn from and connect with other families in their communities in high-priority neighborhoods. Through mid-year, Parent Support and Engagement programs have provided direct services to 1,277 parents and primary caregivers and children. Nearly half (46 percent) of adult participants are between 31 and 40 years of age; 86 percent of participants are female. The majority of parents/primary caregivers served are Hispanic/Latino (49 percent) and African American (18 percent). Student Success in School Funding Strategies

School Based After School programs provide comprehensive after school services at 40 elementary and 19 middle schools in Oakland receiving state After School Education and Safety (ASES) funding and where a majority of students qualify for free and reduced price lunches. OFCY provides additional funding beyond the base grant of \$72,000 for elementary schools and \$85,000 for middle schools to 16 sites with very high rates of students (85 percent and higher) qualifying for free and reduced lunch to address the needs at schools with the highest rates of families impacted by poverty. Through partnership with the OUSD After School Programs Office, OFCY supports programs to continuously build quality practices and provide academic and enrichment support for over 9,000 students annually. The 'lead agency' at each school site coordinates the after school programming and aligns services to school day and district needs and priorities. Through the first six months of FY 2017-2018, school based after school programs have served 7,976 elementary and middle school students, providing over 1.6 million hours of services.

Student Engagement in Learning programs support children and youth's attachment to school and achievements in learning in coordination with the school site and school district. The strategy includes investments in culturally responsive and targeted models to meet the needs of specific populations, including youth who are at risk of not graduating or who are experiencing disparities in academic outcomes. Programs have established ties with school sites, such as Destiny Art Center's Havenscourt Artists-at-School Residency and the Oakland International High School Immigrant and Refugee Wellness Program. Other efforts include district-wide initiatives around school attendance, improved early literacy rates, restorative justice and trauma informed practices, successful transition into high school, and targeted academic and case management services. At mid-point in 2017-2018, programs have served 2,556 students and have provided over 34,000 hours of service. Programs support students ages five to 20 years, with the nearly half (49 percent) of participants ages 14 to 16. Nearly three-quarters of youth served are Hispanic/Latino (43 percent) and African American (31 percent).

### Youth Development and Empowerment Funding Strategies

Year Round Youth Development and Empowerment programs provide access to year-round activities that empower children and youth to develop leadership skills, build on their strengths, improve their connections to adults and peers, and contribute to their communities through arts, technology, entrepreneurship, sports, and other enrichment programming. Programs funded also meet the needs of specific populations, such as LGBTQ youth, boys of color, youth with disabilities, unaccompanied minors, and youth exposed to violence.

Midway through 2017-2018, programs served 5,724 children and youth ages 5-20 years, with the majority of participants (54 percent) between the ages of 14 to 20. Year Round Youth Development programs have provided over 307,000 hours of service to children and youth. Four out of five of participants are African American (38 percent), Hispanic/Latino (35 percent), or Asian (8 percent).

Summer Youth Development and Empowerment programs provide programming during the summer months at community and school sites throughout Oakland, providing children and youth with engaging activities that provide positive experiences while helping to offset summer learning loss. Programs serve youth ages five to 20, but the majority (70 percent) of participants were between the ages of six and 10. The majority of participants are Hispanic/Latino (38 percent) and African American (35 percent). In total, 91 percent of youth enrolled in these programs received 40 or more hours of service, reflecting the full-time nature of the programs.

### Transition to Adulthood Funding Strategy

Career Awareness and Academic Support programs provide older youth (ages 15 to 21) with career awareness, exploration, and preparation within priority industries, as well as college and career advising and other academic supports to facilitate the transition to and persistence in reaching for college and a career. Through the first six months of 2017-2018, programs served 1,488 youth ages 12 to 21, with 80 percent of participants between 15 and 18 years of age. Ninety-one percent of participants are African American (44 percent), Hispanic/ Latino (31 percent), or Asian (16 percent).

Programs have been successful in providing Oakland youth with work-based experience through paid and unpaid internships, subsidized employment, and support to gain direct employment in unsubsidized positions. Program data from June 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018 shows that 1,015 unduplicated youth gained employment experience through OFCY supported programs, working 108,045 hours and earning \$962,230 through wages and stipends. Youth are gaining work experience in hospitals, clinics, government agencies, non-profit organizations, and local businesses through OFCY-supported programs.

### **POLICY ALTERNATIVES**

Alternative	The Kids First! Oakland Children's Fund (Article XIII. of the Oakland City Charter) tasks the POC with submitting funding recommendations to the Oakland City Council for adoption, which can be approved or rejected only in their entirety. Council rejection of any individual grant is not an option, as the rejection of individual grants would be a rejection of the package in its entirety, and would need to be returned to the POC for review and adoption. The policy alternative before Council would be to reject all the funding recommendation from the POC.	
Pros	At the earliest, revised renewal recommendation resulting from Council rejection would be considered by the POC at their July 20 meeting and returned to City Council in September 2018 for adoption after the August recess.	
Cons	Rejection of the funding recommendation would result in a delay in services for programs in 2018-2019 that are projected to serve over 25,000 children and youth.	
Reason for not recommending	The funding recommendations address the priorities in the OFCY FY 2016-2019 Strategic Investment Plan. Rejecting the funding recommendation would result in the delay and potential loss of programming to over 25,000 Oakland children and youth next year.	

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

Approval of the resolution will authorize the City Administrator to enter into a contract with 147 programs from community based and public agencies to support Oakland children and youth in an amount not to exceed \$15,210,316 for FY 2018-2019.

#### 1. AMOUNT OF RECOMMENDATION/COST OF PROJECT:

The total project cost of these grant agreements is \$15,210,316 for 2018-2019.

#### 2. SOURCE OF FUNDING:

The amount of \$15,210,316 is available from FY2018-2019 revenues included in Adopted FY2017-2019 Biennial Budget appropriated in the Oakland Fund for Children and Youth (OFCY) - Kids First Oakland Children's Fund (1780), Youth Services Organization (78251), OFCY 2018-2019 Project (1004172), OFCY FY 2018-2019 Contracts Award (23195).

#### **PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST**

The OFCY Planning and Oversight Committee met on April 11, 2018 in a public meeting at Oakland City Hall to review performance outcomes and unanimously approve grant renewal recommendations for the 147 grant programs and the assignment of the DreamCatcher Youth Services to Covenant House California to serve as managing agency.

### **COORDINATION**

This report and legislation have been reviewed by the Office of the City Attorney, Budget Bureau, and Contracts and Compliance Division of the City Administrator's Office.

#### PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

OFCY grant programs are evaluated annually by independent consultants. Program targets for youth enrollment, hours, and duration of service, and types of activities are captured in the Cityspan grants management database and assessed in the annual evaluation process.

OFCY contracts with Social Policy Research to evaluate programs funded through the Early Childhood Mental Health Consultations, Parent Support and Engagement, Student Engagement in Learning, Year Round Youth Development and Empowerment, Summer Youth Development and Empowerment, and Career Awareness & Academic Support for Older Youth funding strategies. The programs funded through the School Based After School funding strategy are evaluated by the independent evaluation firm Public Profit through a joint evaluation co-funded by Oakland Unified School District.

Both firms have completed mid-year evaluation reports on program progress and performance through the first six months. SPR and Public Profit are continuing to work with programs towards a year-end evaluation report which will additionally incorporate data from youth surveys, adult surveys and focus groups, staff surveys and interviews, site observations, and program quality assessments. The OFCY evaluation supports continuous program improvement through engagement with programs to collect, review, analyze and discuss data outcomes as the basis for informed program planning towards improvement.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

**Economic**: OFCY funding will support 75 agencies operating 147 programs in 2018-2019. These agencies are predominately Oakland-based, employ local staff and have a positive economic impact. In addition, OFCY funds are used to leverage and match additional local, state, federal and foundation funding sources, and thereby bring additional resources into Oakland. Numerous projects will provide direct economic benefit to youth through paid work experience and leadership opportunities.

**Environmental**: Youth programs provide environmental justice, health, restoration work, community advocacy, and recreational activities, as well as providing field trips and camping opportunities.

**Social Equity:** OFCY prioritizes funding for services that reach youth with the greatest need. Programs provide youth leadership opportunities through community engagement, provide high quality academic, enrichment, social and recreational activities to low-income children and youth, and are focused on serving children living in high stress neighborhoods.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO RENEW THE OAKLAND FUND FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH GRANT AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND VARIOUS PUBLIC AND NON-PROFIT AGENCIES TO PROVIDE DIRECT SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH IN FY 2018-2019 IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$15,210,316; WHICH INCLUDES THE AWARD OF ONE GRANT TO COVENANT HOUSE CALIFORNIA IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$51,500

WHEREAS, Measure K/Kids First! Initiative established the Oakland Fund for Children and Youth ("OFCY") in 1996 to help young people grow to become healthy, productive, and honorable adults; and

WHEREAS, the passage of Measure D in 2009 revised the Kids First Charter Amendment and established a second 12-year life cycle for the Kids First! Children's Fund administered through OFCY; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Oversight Committee ("POC") provides oversight and direction for the OFCY planning and funding review process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved the OFCY Strategic Investment Plan 2016-2019 on October 20, 2015 (Resolution No. 85844 C.M.S.) as developed by the POC; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted the POC's recommendation of 150 grant awards in June 2016, after the release of the Request for Proposals (RFP) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-2019 OFCY grant services for children and youth in 2016-2017, renewable for two additional one-year periods with Council approval, by Resolution No. 86226 C.M.S.; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted the POC's recommendation to renew 148 grant awards in June 2017 for the second year of funding for FY 2017-2018, by Resolution No. 86792 C.M.S.; and

WHEREAS, revenues for FY 2018-2019 in the amount of \$16,715,050are included in the Adopted FY 2017-2019 Budget and are appropriated to the Kids First! Oakland Children's Fund (1780), and no more than 10% is to be available for the administration and evaluation of OFCY and no less than 90% of the appropriation in the amount of \$15,043,545is to be available for grants, budgeted in the Oakland Fund for Children and Youth (OFCY) - Kids First Oakland Children's Fund (1780), Youth Services Organization (78251), OFCY FY 2018-2019 Project (1004172), OFCY FY 2018-2019 Contracts Award (23195); and

WHEREAS, as specified in the Kids First! Charter Amendment, no less than 90% of Kids First! monies shall be used to pay for eligible services for children and youth and no more than 10% of Kids First! monies shall be used to pay for the administrative costs and any interest earned and amounts unspent or uncommitted by the Fund at the end of any Fiscal Year are to be made available for future grants as specified in the Kids First! Charter Article XIII; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to allocate 90% portion of said funds to selected grant awards resulting from the OFCY 2016-2019 Request for Proposals for direct services for children and youth in FY 2018-2019, and 10% to the administration and evaluation of OFCY, in accordance with the terms of Kids First! Charter Article XIII; and

WHEREAS, the POC created by the Measure K – Kids First! Initiative in 1996, provides oversight and direction for the OFCY planning and funding review process; and under Resolution No. 86792 C.M.S., the appropriations for services for children and youth in 2017-2018 may be continued to 2018-2019, and the grants agreements for targeted services are to be renewed as forwarded by the POC subject to performance review; and

WHEREAS, through the RFP process in June 2016, the City Council approved an OFCY grant award to the agency Alameda Family Services for the DreamCatcher Youth Services program (Resolution No. 86226 C.M.S.); and

WHEREAS, the agency Alameda Family Services has transferred management of the DreamCatcher Youth Services program to Covenant House California; and

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2018, the POC approved transfer of the program grant for DreamCatcher Youth Services to Covenant House California to ensure direct services for homeless youth ages 13 to 18; and

WHEREAS, the POC recommends the substitution of Covenant House California to manage the program grant in the amount specified below for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019; and

WHEREAS, the POC has reviewed the mid-year 2017-2018 performance of the OFCY grantees in FY 2017-2018; and

WHEREAS, one program that was funded in FY 2017-2018, Northern California Society to Prevent Blindness, an Affiliate of the National Society to Prevent Blindness, has declined the renewal of the OFCY grant for FY2018-2019; and

WHEREAS, the POC recommends the renewal of grant agreements for 147 programs as specified below for FY 2018-2019, the third and final year of the current three-year funding cycle, and the addition of Covenant House California – DreamCatcher Youth Services program listed in Grant ID No. 99 specified below with the revision to reflect change in the agency name and placement in the listing of funding strategies:
